He furthermore explained that the City's Heritage branch is assisting the Property Management department to complete the documentation.

The Subcouncil 2 Manager informed that, at the previous Subcouncil 2 meeting, it was indicated that there was no heritage status linked to the building and that the department could embark on unfruitful expenditure on the matter.

Ald M Nieuwoudt responded that she is very frustrated as to how this matter has been dealt with. She indicated that Mr P Strumpher is aware of the situation and even gave a notice to the Lion's Club to vacate. She enquired if the City cannot continue with the lease and part of the condition is that the City continue with the process. She furthermore commented that, while everyone is hovering over that specific space, it is going to be invaded. Should this happen, the Property Management department would I be kept accountable for it. She requested decisive action in terms of by when the agreement will be finalised and when it will be signed. She also commented that she is beyond consulting and if Subcouncil 2 is taking the delegations seriously on monitoring service. the matter needs to escalated to the City Manager and disciplinary action be requested none service delivery from the department.

The Subcouncil 2 Manager informed the meeting that she requested Mr M Pinder: Transport Planning to be present for the meeting. Cllr B Hansen informed the meeting that she also did not receive any further information from the Mayco Member, Ald F Purchase on the matter. The Subcouncil 2 Office will follow up on the matter.

Cllr R Bresler informed the meeting that the origin of the original motion was to achieve a successful outcome on the R300 which is not in the planning. He suggested that, on the R300 & N1 matter, SANRAL come and present what they are going to do there in order for the Subcouncil to have a clear understanding of what is going to be done. He referred to the Subcouncil manager's feedback and suggested that we need to have the focus back on the original motion submitted to the Subcouncil and on what was decided.

The chairperson commented that currently there is no response from. Ald F Purchase furthermore indicated that there was a SANRAL request for a meeting but it was cancelled twice already. She requested that a meeting be arranged with Province and all other relevant role players in order to have an in-depth discussion on the matter.

Ald M Nieuwoudt commented that she knows there is a proposal from the City's Transport Plan and if Cllr R Bresler can investigate as to what extend this can utilised as an opportunity to prioritise the R300 North.

Ald M Nieuwoudt indicated that the Transport Plan is out for revision and if the Subcouncil 2 Manager can enquire where in the process the plan is, and alert the councillors and to take it from there in terms of input into the Transport Plan.

# 5. 02SUB24/11/2018: LATEST INFORMATION ON THE ILLEGAL FARMING ON ERF STE20-19, CORNER OF MAROELA AND BOTFONTEIN ROADS, WALLACEDENE

The Subcouncil 2 Manager informed the meeting that the department indicated that the report is still with the legal department and that it would be submitted for the next meeting in January 2021.

The chairperson enquired if any feedback was received from Director: Wilfred Johannes Solomons. The meeting was informed that currently Director: Wilfred Johannes Solomons is on leave but will follow up on the matter.

Ald M Nieuwoudt referred to the Subcouncil 2 Activity day of 16 November 2020 where the Subcouncil delegations were discussed. She commented that it was very clear that officials cannot choose to not attend meetings and that those officials who are not in attendance should be reported in order to set examples in terms of accountability. She furthermore enquired what the possibility may be if Subcouncil invite the City Manager for an urgent site visit in order to see for himself the conditions that the people and animals are living in. She cautioned the meeting that this is a situation that is not being created or identified during the Covid-19 epidemic. The Subcouncil has been struggling with the matter for years. She requested that a background with all correspondences be forwarded to the City Manager to intervene and visit the area.

E Adams: Recreation and Parks indicated that his department is waiting on feedback from the Legal department on the disposal of the land. He confirmed that the Recreation and Parks department are not going to utilise the open space for future developments and that the department is exploring alternative mechanisms. The department is also in discussion with Urban Management as well as Property Management to take over the administration of the property. The intension of the department is not to evict.

Ald M Nieuwoudt requested that a report be submitted on the reservation by Urban Management because the Legal department will not assist with the above mentioned process. She explained it is a different process whereby Recreation and Parks is the custodians of the erf, and need to write a report to the Subcouncil to support the department to transfer the land as they are not in need of it anymore.

Ald G Twigg informed the meeting that Urban Management could not take over the administration of the land as this is the function of Property Management.

E Adams responded that Recreation and Parks mainly engaged with the Property Management Department in terms of assistance and guidance.

Mr P Strumpher: Property Management department responded and informed the meeting that the correct procedure in terms of the handover protocol is that a department remains responsible for the property until a new asset user is found. He proposed that the land physically be hand over from the Recreation and Parks department to the Transversal Real Estate department (TRES) as the department works across all the departments in terms of investigating useful land. A proper investigation consultation will take place with all departments to establish if there are interested parties within the internal departments who would be able to take over the administration or if it should be made available in the open market.

Cllr S Mbandezi commented that the land can be transferred to Informal Settlements as it is invaded by informal structures. He said the issue is coming on for long and requested who at the Legal Department is delaying the matter.

The Subcouncil 2 manager informed the meeting that the land is invaded and the main issue is farm animals that is not allowed on and causing a health risk. She mentioned previously an investigation was done and Informal Settlements was requested to reserve the land and to include it in the future planning for that area. She suggested that the Transversal Real Estate department do an investigation on where to move the farm animals to, because the farmers are prepared to move to alternative farm land. If alternative land issue can be addressed, then Human Settlements department can reserve that area and the land does not to be sold.

E Adams: Recreation and Park informed the meeting that they will follow up on the matter and liaise with the Transversal Real Estate Section and revert back to Subcouncil 2 with a formal report and the way forward.

Cllr S Mbandezi mentioned that he does not understand why Informal Settlements in the Human Settlements department has not been engaging with the Recreation and Parks department as they are in the right position to engage. It was informed that Informal Settlements was approached but did not want to engage on the matter.

Ald M Nieuwoudt responded that the whole process goes around in circles and suggested that the item be removed from the Matters Receiving Attention. She proposed that the Subcouncil manager compile a report on the history and what the Subcouncil has done so far and recommend a way forward. In such a way the manager can liaise with all the other department in terms of the feedback.

The Subcouncil 2 manager informed the meeting that is what she had done previously and various workshops were arranged. However, no department wants to take responsibility nor be part of the solution. The Subcouncil Chairperson then recommended that the matter be referred to Director: Wilfred Johannes Solomons to assist with the process. She will follow up with the director and revert back to the councillors in terms of a way forward.

Having said this, we have re-commenced the technical drafting process and aim to complete the drafting, legislative review and Portfolio Committee report by 4 February 2021. The report requesting authority to commence public participation should then serve before the Transport PC on 4 March 2021, following which it will serve at the Subcouncils."

Several complaints are received regarding replacement of half round channels with a formal storm water pipe system and detention facilities.

There are approximately 43 00m of round channels in the area. The budget would amount to +- R1 200 per metre.

The feedback from the Roads and Storm water department is:

- 1. Such a project will need a storm water modelling of the area and the relevant design to the accompany the modelling.
- 2. The replacement of the kerbs is calculated at +- 41km of roads with half-round channels both sides and +- 2km of road with half round channel on one side.
