APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF LIQUOR TRADING HOURS IN RESPECT OF: FICTION, 226-228 LONG STREET, CAPE TOWN: ON CONSUMPTION: 02:00-04:00

3. PURPOSE

To decide on an application for extension of liquor trading hours in terms of Section 6(1) of the City of Cape Town: Control of Undertakings that Sell Liquor to the Public By-Law, 2013

4. FOR DECISION BY

SubCouncil in terms of Delegation 4(2)

To approve, refuse or vary applications for extension of trading hours on premises where liquor licences have been granted.

5. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The City of Cape Town: Control of Undertakings that Sell Liquor to the Public By-Law, 2013, was promulgated on 17 January and coming into effect on 01 February 2014.

An application for extension of liquor trading hours in terms of Section 6 (1) of the By-law was submitted to the Health Directorate and circulated to the relevant departments for comment. The fully signed application, including all required comments was submitted to the SubCouncil 16 Manager, and was then circulated to abutting neighbours, all organisations included on the Ward 115 database and ward committee members for comment.

Clause 9 of the By-law requires that the City must, before approving an application for the extension of trading days and hours, reasonably and fairly consider further factors which must include, inter alia-

(a) the validity of the liquor licence;

- (b) where applicable, the validity of a business licence issued in terms of the Businesses Act of 1991 (Act No. 71 of 1991);
- (c) location category as per the Schedule;
- (d) previous suspension, amendment or revocation of extended trading days and hours including previous records of complaints investigated and confirmed in respect of the last twelve months preceding a current application for extension;
- (e) the proximity of the licensed premises to surrounding residential zoned area, cultural, religious and educational facilities;
- (f) outcome of community consultation and the recommendation of the relevant ward;
- (g) the potential impact on the surrounding environment;
- (h) whether it is in the public interest to approve and grant an extension of trading days or hours; or
- (i) a motivation from the applicant dealing with the impact of -
 - (i) the risks to and nuisances on the surrounding community;
 - (ii) mitigation measures to assist the control of risks and nuisances; and
 - (iii) possible benefits of extended liquor trading hours and days on the surrounding community.
- (10) The basis and rationale behind all decision-making must be recorded.

6. DISCUSSION

- 6.1 Section 6 (1) of the By-Law reads as follows:
 6(1) Subject to subsection (5), (6) and (7) a licensee may upon payment of the required fee, submit a written application to the City to extend the liquor trading days and hours of licensed premises.
- 6.2 The following application for extension of liquor trading hours in terms of Section 6 (1) of the By-law has been received by the Subcouncil

REASONS / REPRESENTATIONS

THE APPLICANT

- The applicant is Birhed Properties (Pty) Ltd, a company with limited liability, duly incorporated in accordance with the laws of the Republic of South Africa with registration number 2001/002710/07 and having its principal place of business at First Floor & Second Floor, 226 Long Street, Cape Town.
- The Applicant is the holder of an on-consumption liquor licence issued under Western Cape Liquor Authority reference WCP/042484 in respect of a business conducted under the name and style of Fiction.
- 3. Birhed Properties (Pty) Ltd, by way of a director's resolution, has authorised Sacaro Motto of Saunders Attorneys to sign all documentation necessary to bring the application. A copy of the resolution is annexed hereto as **Annexure B.**
- 4. The said licence is in terms of Section 89(2)(d) of the Western Cape Liquor Act, Act 4 of 2008 (as amended) (hereinafter referred to as "The Act") deemed to be a licence for the sale of liquor for consumption on the licensed premises.
- 5. The Applicant is thus the holder of a valid liquor licence, a copy annexed hereto as **Annexure C**.

THE APPLICATION

- 6. Application is made by the Applicant in terms of the Control of Undertakings to Sell Liquor to the Public By-Law, 2013, for the extension of its liquor trading hours from 11H00 to 04H00 the following day as envisaged in Section 6 of the By-Law.
- 7. The City Of Cape Town deemed it fit to determine the trading days and hours in the schedule to the By-Law restricting the trading hours between 11H00 to 02H00 the following day with the provision in Section 6(1) of the By-Law that a licensee of the premises contained in categories (3), (4) and (5) of the Schedule to the By-Law, may submit an application to the Council for an extension of hours during which they may trade. The applicant is a licensee of the premises as contemplated in category (3) of the Schedule to the By-Law.
- 8. The provisions of Section 89(10) of the Act are applicable to the Applicant. This application is therefore to maintain the *status quo* in terms of the trading hours which the business has been granted over a number of years.

CONCLUSION

- 9. The Applicant has traded strictly in terms of its existing licence conditions and trading hours. The business forms an integral part of the Cape Town entertainment precinct, where any number of competing businesses are in operation, some of which enjoy trading hours until 04H00.
- 10. The applicant has also been issued with the appropriate business licence for its premises by the City of Cape Town, and as evidenced from a copy of the said business licence annexed hereto marked **Annexure D**.
- 11. Given the existing on-consumption liquor licence and the business licence, it is clear that the premises are correctly zoned for their ongoing usage as a licensed entertainment venue.
- 12. The request to maintain the *status quo* in terms of the trading hours which is a commercial one driven, by competition from the demands from the many tourists and visitors to the Cape Town area who recognise and enjoy the facilities on offer in the area known as one of Cape Town's best entertainment precincts.
- 13. More importantly, and in terms of the City of Cape Town Liquor Trading Days and Hours By-Law, as amended, the Applicant also applied and was granted an extension of trading hours in 2018.

14. It is therefore requested that this application be granted at the first available opportunity, so as to retain the *status quo* which has existed with regard to the Applicants trading hours, and as evidenced from **Annexure E** hereto, which confirms the applicants extended trading hours previously granted.



2. TRADING HOURS

Trading days and hours will be as determined by the local authority. The sale and consumption of liquor will be restricted to the hours of trade as approved by the Local Authority / LLT, as the case may be.

3. THE LICENCED PREMISES

- 3.1 The licenced premises is the area indicated in colour on the signed plan as approved and attached to the liquor licence.
- 3.2 No liquor may be stored, sold, served or consumed in any area not indicated for that purpose on the plan.
- 3.3 No changes, extensions or alterations may be made to the licenced premises unless previously approved by the Liquor Licencing Tribuna or the Preciding Officer of the WESTERN CAPE LIQUOR AUTHORITY

4. THE LICENSEE

n 9 SEP 2019

4.1 The person or entity approved as licensee is the only person or entity entitled to this extremely liquor licence for the sale of liquor.

- 4.2 The person or licensee may not let the liquor licence to anyone. The licence, or financial interest in the licensee of 5% or more, may not be transferred and no other person is allowed to use or benefit from the liquor licence unless a certificate authorising same has been approved by the Liquor Licencing Tribunal and issued by the Western Cape Liquor Authority.
- 4.3 Unless the licensee is a natural person, the licensee must ensure that a manager, residing in the Western Cape, is at all times appointed in respect of the liquor licence.



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7. DOCUMENTS TO BE DISPLAYED

The Licensee must ensure that the following original documents or a certified colour copy thereof is:

- 7.1 displayed inside the licenced premises on a conspicuous place:
 - 7.1.1 the liquor licence in respect of the premises (Form 4 or 11); and
 - 7.1.2 the plan approved as part of the liquor licence.
- 7.2 available on the premises and be made available upon request:
 - 7.2.1 the conditions applicable in respect of the liquor licence;
 - 7.2.2 the manager appointment approved by the Authority;
 - 7.2.3 certificates regarding the removal or transfer of the liquor licence;
 - 7.2.4 any document issued by the Authority to change, supplement or replace any of the aforementioned;
 - 7.2.5 the latest renewal notice; and
 - 7.2.6 proof of payment of the renewal in respect of the relevant year.

8. PROHIBITION ON LIQUOR SOLD TO MINORS

8.1 The licensee and/or the manager or person in charge at the licensed premises MUST, before any liquor is sold, ensure that the person the liquor is supplied to is above the age of 18 years.

8.2 No person under the age of 18 years is allowed on the licensed premises

9. RESTRICTED AREA

0 9 SEP 2019

- 9.1 Except as provided for in section 55(1) and section 56(1) of the Act a licensee may not permit a person under the age of eighteen (18) years to enter a restricted area.
- 9.2 A restricted area is -
 - a room or any place on licensed premises where liquor is sold over a counter, except when meals are being served to diners seated at tables in such a room or place;
 - (ii) a room or place which the Liquor Licensing Tribunal has demarcated as an area in which persons under the age of eighteen (18) years are not allowed to be; and
- 9.3 A person under the age of eighteen (18) years may have access to a restricted area if accompanied either by a parent or a guardian or by an adult with the consent of a parent or a guardian, unless the conditions under which the licence was granted, determines otherwise.
- 9.4 Every restricted area must be indicated as such in a manner as prescribed.

14 TOILETS

Adequate and suitable toilet facilities must be provided for the use of patrons on or near 14.1. the licensed premises.

The toilet facilities must at all times be maintained in a neat, tidy and hygienic condition. 14.2

15 STORAGE

- A licensee must store his, her or its liquor on the licensed premises or in such other or 15.1 additional place within the Province as may be approved by the Liquor Licensing Tribunal when granting a licence or by the Presiding Officer, on application, at any time thereafter.
- A licensee may not sell, supply or allow the consumption of liquor in or from such other 15.2 or additional place of storage.

16 EMPLOYMENT

A licensee may not employ a person under the age of eighteen (18) years in connection 16.1. with the sale or supply of liquor unless such a person is -

(i) of or above the age of sixteen (16) years; and

(ii) undergoing training in catering services; and

(iii) apprenticed to the licensee.

- (ii) supply liquor to an employee instead of wages;
- (iii)deduct from an employee's wages the cost of liquor supplied to the employee or any other person on his or her behalf; or
- (iv)withhold payment of the wages of an employee in lieu of a debt in respect of the sale or supply of liquor.

17 ACCESS TO THE LICENCED PREMISES BY DESIGNATED LIQUOR OFFICER AND LIQUOR INSPECTOR

A designated liquor officer and a liquor inspector may exercise the powers referred to in section 74 of the Act, relating to the entry, inspection and search of the premises at any time when the business is being conducted and at any time when business may be conducted in terms of the applicable by-law or hours as specified in these conditions.



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19 CONTRAVENTIONS

Any contravention of or failure to comply with one or more of the conditions of the liquor license constitutes an offence and may result in the liquor license being revoked or such other sanction may be imposed as provided for in the Act.

20 VICARIOUS RESPONSIBILITY

The Licensee needs to acquaint himself / herself/ it with the conditions contained in Section 83 of the Act, which allows for the licensee to be held liable and responsible for all acts or omissions committed by the manager, agent or employee of the Licensee and such other person will also be

liable for those actions/omissions committed by him/her.

21 GENERAL

21.1 If any one of the conditions of this licence is found to be lilegal or unconstitutional, the rest of the conditions will remain in force and that section that is found to be illegal/unconstitutional shall be deemed to be severable from the rest of the conditions

and as if it had not been written at all.

21.2 Potable water must be available free of charge upon request at all times when liquor is

sold.







APPLICATION IN TERMS OF EXTENDED TRADING HOURS: FICTION (WCP/042484)

We refer to the single objection by St Martini Evangelic Lutheran Church.

The applicant replies to the objection as follows;

- The objection by the St Martini Evangelic Lutheran Church does not in any way attempt to deal with the merits of the application under consideration, but simply makes a sweeping statement regarding dumped waste.
- 2. The applicant has been granted extended trading hours in previous years, and this application is merely to renew the extended trading hours, not to introduce new hours into the area.
- 3. The Law Enforcement report also confirms that no complaints whatsoever have been received in respect of the premises.
- 4. An approval of the application therefore merely maintains the status quo, and authorises the business to continue in the same manner in which it's regular patrons are accustomed to.

This objection also in no way deals with the merits of the application, the trading history of the premises, or the fact that extended hours have existed previously, and no incidents relating thereto have arisen or been reported, which is again why the Law Enforcement report is entirely positive.
- 6. There are also at least 5 other liquor licensed establishments on Long Street which are closer to the Church than the applicant's premises. Refer to annexure "A".
- 7. In the circumstances, we request that the application now be finalised at the first available opportunity, given that no evidence whatsoever is presented to suggest the applicant is responsible for beer bottles being dumped onto the church premises. The applicant also strongly denies the allegation, given that it's waste disposal is done on it's own premises and in the ordinary course of solid waste disposal.
