Trees	Trees maintained and removed are logged on maintenance register.
	Pro-active and Re-active tree maintenance is continuously undertaken by our internal team and appointed tenderers.
Mowing	100% of mowing performed by internal teams (mainly road reserves). POS and Road Reserves are maintained and cut as Recreation and Parks Department Minimum Maintenance Standards.
Park Equipment	The repair to play equipment is continuous and it remains a challenge due to high usage and vandalism. Major repairs are performed by a contractor using existing tender, 457G/2015/2016 and minor repairs are serviced by the internal team.
	All play Equipment are inspected monthly and maintained as per service required and in line with Recreation and Parks Department Minimum Standards.
