7.6 Report for period October - December 2019

This report provides information about the programmes and Ward Allocation projects implemented by the SD&ECD Eastern Area within Sub Council 9 for the period of October 2019 – December 2019.

7.6.1 Strengthening Families Interventions implemented

Definition: This is a licensed, structured, evidence based life skills programme that improves family relationship and reduces their vulnerability to substance abuse.

Objective: To facilitate a holistic programme to increase the resilience of children aged between 9 – 11 within family groups.

Outcome:

- To enhance children's protective and resilience factors by improving their social life, peer resistance and communication skills.
- To improve parent/child family relations, communication and organization.
- To improve adult parenting skills, reductions in excessive punishment or lacks discipline and improvement in parenting self-efficiency.
- To reduce youth behavior problems (i.e substance abuse, conduct disorders, aggression, violence and juvenile delinquency) as well as reduced emotional problems and psychosomatic disorders.

7.6.2 Number of EPWP Job Opportunities created

Definition: The WFC program is a Women's Developmental program that aims to create EPWP work opportunities through an empowerment program aimed at vulnerable women. The program was developmental in nature and intended to capacitate women to play a more meaningful and active role in their communities and broader society. The women were exposed to various developmental programs as identified by their individual Personal Development plans(PDP's).

The following training will be provided:

- First Aid,
- Conflict Management,


