5. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report is for the health facilities within the boundaries of sub council 6 for the period 1 July 2019 to 30 September 2019. The report covers both Personal Primary Health Care (PPHC) and Environmental Health Services (EH). Overall the facilities are doing well and are meeting most of its targets (detailed performance report available on request).

7. DISCUSSION/CONTENTS

City Health Department is responsible for two main focus areas of service delivery namely; Personal Primary Health Care (PPHC) which includes Kasselsvlei Clinic, Parow Clinic and St. Vincent CDC as well as Environmental Health Services (EH). The performance of each unit is presented below as measured against specific set SDBIP targets.

7.1 PERSONAL PRIMARY HEALTH CARE

This part of the report highlights performance of the clinics in relation to the SDBIP, focusing on key indicators namely reduction of HIV, AIDS, TB & Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI), reduction of death rate for children under 5 years, antenatal care & teenage pregnancy.

Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV), Acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS), and Tuberculosis (TB) & Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI) Programme:

This programme is aimed at preventing and reducing the aforementioned diseases and related deaths. For the period under review, performance for this programme is as follows:

Parow and St Vincent did not meet the target for the number of total clients tested for HIV. Outreaches are planned to improve the testing. St Vincent did not meet the number of new clients enrolled on anti-retroviral treatment. The three patients were not medically fit to start treatment at that stage.

All the facilities exceeded the targets for the percentage of HIV positive TB patients commenced on anti-retroviral treatment.

Condom distribution is an accumulative target and will increase especially during December (focus on World AIDS Day).

Child and Youth Health

Programmes under child health and youth health are aimed at preventing and reducing childhood and youth diseases as well as deaths related to such diseases. Child and Youth Health programmes performance are as follows: -

Parow and St Vincent did not reach the targets for the percentage immunisation coverage from hexavalent 1st dose to fully immunised under one year. Active recalling of patients will be done. Challenges include incorrect addresses and contact details.

All three facilities did not meet the number of reproductive health clients under 18 years, despite implementing youth services at a dedicated daily time slot. More health awareness will be done. An ongoing challenge is schools do not want to allow Health to access the schools with the service.

St Vincent did not meet the visit to schools for health promotion outreach programmes. However, the target for the percentage of preschools visited was exceeded.

Women's Health

Women's Health is one of the priority programmes that the City monitors very closely. This programme is aimed at preventing and reducing disease and deaths of women as result of cancer, child birth etc.

Parow and St Vincent did not meet the number of cervical smear coverage due to missed opportunities in the facilities. Current practices will be re-assessed and plans in place for improvement including outreaches and individual targets per clinician.

All three facilities exceeded the target for percentage antenatal 1st visits before 20 weeks except. Booking early is to ensure safety of the mother and the unborn child.

Female condoms are still a challenge due to reluctance of the community to use it, but the department will continue to raise awareness.

7.2 ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

This part of the report covers the performance of Environmental Health Services on key SDBIP indicators.

Informal Settlements

Once a week environmental health practitioners (EHP) visit every informal settlement to monitor conditions. For the period under review the EHP's have done 169 visits against the target of 169. However, the target for health and hygiene projects in informal settlements was not met due to sporadic volatile periods.

Water Safety & Quality

A total of 303 water samples were tested and all were compliant with the quality standards, thus exceeding the target for compliance of 99% for the sub district.

All (100%) of the samples tested were compliant with the quality standards, thus exceeding the target of 99% for the sub district. These samples are taken at strategic points linked to the end users.

Food Hygiene and Safety

On a regular basis, environmental health practitioners (EHPs) take food samples from various outlets/businesses to monitor food hygiene and safety. These samples included food products, bacteriological swabs from the hands of food handlers and surfaces where food products are prepared.

A number of 246 food samples were tested and 214 (87%) were compliant with legislation standards, thus exceeding the target of 75% for the sub district. The necessary remedial actions were taken in all cases of non-compliance which included written notices to owners and managers of restaurants and butcheries.

Pre-School visits

A total of 405 (100%) pre-schools were visited during the reporting period in order to ensure compliance to the relevant environmental health standards for child care centers. Monitoring of these facilities include health and safety aspects referred to in terms of the Early Childhood Policy of the City of Cape Town and the Regulations Governing General Hygiene Requirements and the Transport of Food. Target was exceeded.
