MOTION RECEIVED FROM COUNCILLOR DANILE KHATSHWA REGARDING THE VANDALIZED WHITE PREFAB STRUCTURE TO BE UTILIZED BY THE SENIOR CITIZENS CLUB

A document that has been circulated and speaks around the facilities that has no Lead Department in Khayelitsha as a whole. There was also a memorandum from the City Manager that the Line Departments must take responsibility of those structures.

He said they went through each structure and to look at the potential and the current usage of the structure and provided the Department with a report of the status of the facilities.

He said some of the facilities will be leased out to the community based organisations who are currently active in these structures. The Council will have to make the call as to which Department is responsible for these structures.

Cllr Khatshwa wanted to know whether the Council is going to address the issue of the basic services that is not connected to most of these structures particularly the one in his ward. Various questions were asked and it was suggested to let Area East complete the investigation and when the report is submitted to the Sub Council then it can be commented on.

The sub council Manager Mr Goodman Lulamile Rorwana reported that this falls under SANRAL and the Project Manager is Gail Bester. He said there is a development taking place on the N2 starting from R300 to Baden Powell Road and will do upgrades on the three interchanges i.e. Mew Way, Spine Road and Baden Powell Road with additional lanes on both sides of the N2 and the erecting of traffic lights will form part of this project. The last communication received from SANRAL was that the project will commence in the next six to twelve months. The final report is awaited on the progress made thus far.
