Part 25 11(1) To decide within its area of jurisdiction where traffic calming measures are to be applied within the relevant legislation and policy and; after considering a report from the Transport for Cape Town Directorate.

4. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Council of the City of Cape Town ADOPTED the Traffic Calming Policy on (28 May 2008-vide C11/05/08; amended 22 June 2011 vide C08/06/11) to ensure the safety of all road users on residential streets through a multi-disciplinary approach, namely, the disciplines of engineering; enforcement and education being present in the correct balance in order to effect a solution to road safety. In this regard, the policy describes actions that should be taken cognizance of in respect of remedial engineering measures in order to improve safety of road users on existing residential streets (Class 5) and under certain circumstances, local distributors (Class 4) as well as the method of management of these actions. In regard to the programme of management of the Traffic Calming Policy, a four step process is identified for managing the Remedial Engineering Measures focusing on the role, responsibilities and procedure to be followed by Councillors and the Manager of a Subcouncil.

The Ward Councillor, Ald M Oliver undertook the preliminary assessment for traffic calming measures for Sandown Road, OTTERY

as a result of numerous complaints by residents to an increase in vehicular traffic which is to be commented on or endorsed by Subcouncil 18 for onward submission to the Transport for Cape Town Directorate - (Annexure A) is the preliminary screening report.

RECOMMENDATION

Delegated: to the subcouncil to make a recommendation on the provision of traffic calming measures

DISCUSSION/CONTENTS

The Traffic Calming Policy of the Council of the City of Cape Town describes actions that should be taken cognizance of in respect of remedial engineering measures in order to improve safety of road users on existing residential streets (Class 5) and, under certain circumstances, local distributors (Class 4) as well as the method of management of these actions. In regard to the programme of management of the Traffic Calming Policy, a four step process is identified for managing the Remedial Engineering measures focusing on the role, responsibilities and procedure to be followed by Councillors and the Manager of a Sub-council.

5.1. Constitutional and Policy Implications

TRAFFIC CALMING POLICY –approved by Council on 28 May 2008, vide C11/05/08-amended by Council on 22 June 2011 vide C08/06/11

The Policy endeavours to ensure that the City use remedial engineering measures where appropriate to improve safety for all road users, with special focus on vulnerable road users, on residential streets (Class 5) and local distributors (Class 4). The policy highlights that the improvement of road safety on residential streets can be accomplished through the attainment of the following objectives:

- The reduction of vehicle speeds to appropriate levels;
- The removal of excessive extraneous traffic;
- The enhancement of facilities for vulnerable road users;
- A uniform traffic management approach across City.

7.3 Financial Implications

Costing of the traffic calming project is determined after the technical assessment. Funding will need to be planned in the next budgetary process.

It is important to note that:-

TOCT is presently focusing on pedestrian safety at schools (which the directorate is funding) for future financial years with the benchmark of at least 50 schools per year.

Ward Councillors may identify, motivate and fund traffic calming measures in response to a proven history of accidents on a road or in response to a recent and very urgent incident that demands immediate intervention.

Private persons or organisations may also fund traffic calming measures, subject to the prescribed conditions.

Traffic calming measures will be assessed during this process should a budget be determined through ward allocation funding. If funds are not determined, it will be assessed eventually and placed on the substantial list of projects still requiring funding.

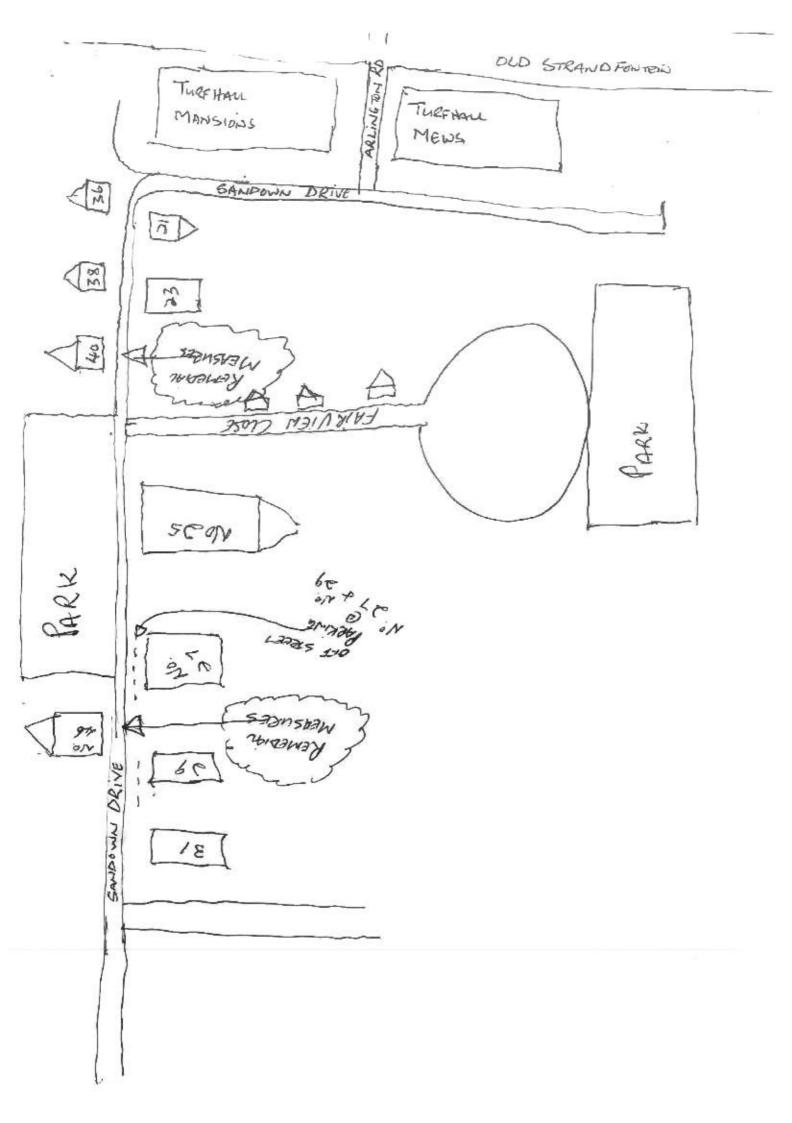
