Mr Dimitri Georgeades attended the Subcouncil Activity Day on 14 August 2018 to provide feedback on the Motion of Exigency to declare Maitland Garden Village Heritage Status.

Mr Georgeades indicated that they have done the grading and have an updated inventory as well as a draft dossier. According to him Maitland Garden Village is very homogeneous and haven't changed much, since 1922, in contrast to Bo-Kaap as an example.

He informed the Subcouncil that Councillor Little and his manager had a meeting with the residents of Maitland Garden Village and it became evident that the community perceives the Two Rivers Urban Park (TRUP) (Policy Exercise) as a potential threat. He explained that TRUP policy seeks to unlock developmental potential along provincial and municipal land along the precinct.

Mr Georgeades highlighted the following with reference to Maitland Garden Village:

- (a) Roughly half are privately owned (Alderman Watkyns to provide complete figures)
- (b) Across the board single residential zoning

He added that it is relatively easy to put a HPOZ (Heritage Protection Overlay Zone) in Maitland Garden Village in place with development guidelines for the owners. If so, strict rezoning measures will have to be included to discourage commercialisation along Alexander Road. The aforementioned can be written into the HPOZ.

NOTE: The members used this opportunity to discuss inter alia the Progress on the Langa HPOZ and the Extension of the Pinelands HPOZ. The discussion to this item was emailed to the members on 23 August 2018 and is filed accordingly.
