#### PURPOSE

To review proposed 11 sites for the discharge of fireworks proposed by inter alia the various sub-councils.

### 4. FOR DECISION BY

All sub-councils as per System of Delegations (v3) adopted by Council on 28 March 2019 Resolution C18/03/19:

 Part 24 – Sub-councils, delegation 7(2) – To grant permission for the use of public open spaces, public squares and similar places within the Sub-council's area of jurisdiction, for any local events.

### 5. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In order for the City of Cape Town to control the illegal discharge of fireworks during Guy Fawkes, Diwali & New Year's Eve festivities, dedicated public open sites were previously allocated across the City. Due to some of the prior to 2014 designated sites not complying to set health and safety criteria, it was decided to review these sites, as proposed by inter alia the various subcouncils.

The proposals were discussed during a workshop attended by Councilors and officials of the Events Office, Fire & Rescue, Health, Law Enforcement and Disaster Risk Management, and 11 sites were initially identified for the discharge of fireworks.

It was also decided at the workshop, that in view of the financial implications for the City, a sub-committee be established in order to further review the 11 sites. The sub-committee then made recommendations for a maximum of 11 sites in the City, for the public discharge of fireworks and these have remained in place over the past years. Therefore, the submission for review as attached was discussed at sub-councils, sub-council workshops and various recommendations were submitted and investigated by Fire and Rescue Service (reports attached). The Fire and Rescue Service thank the sub-councils for its recommendations. The proposed review report is for scrutiny and comment and once accepted a follow up report will be submitted to all sub councils for authorization.

### 6. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that:

a) The proposed 11 sites for the discharge of fireworks be reviewed by sub council

#### 7.3 Financial Implications

Advertisement Cost:

The cost to place an advertisement in the 3 local newspapers (Cape Times, Cape Argus and Die Burger) as well as the 40 community newspapers, amounts to approximately R150 000,00.

The other disciplines (Disaster Risk Management, Health Department, Parks & Recreation, Law Enforcement, Events Office) have been consulted and will make provision for their own cost incurred when providing staff on overtime during these events.

Disaster Risk Management normally bears the costs for advertising the events, as it falls within their ambit of responsibility, in terms of notifying the public, however, all communication budgets have been transferred to Corporate Communication Services and they have indicated that the Fire and Rescue Service should fund the necessary publication.

The cost for monitoring these 11 sites, in terms of a Fire Life Safety officer as well as a motorized fire pump and personnel being present, would amount to:




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## The criteria that sites have to comply with are: -

- The area where the fireworks are to be discharged must be:
  - At least 100 m from buildings, roads and railway lines.
  - At least 20 m from telephone lines, telegraph lines, power lines, trees and overhead obstructions.
  - Must be at least 500 m from any petroleum depot, explosives magazine and gas cylinders.
  - An area is to be kept clear of persons (spectators), which shall extend at least 50 m from the front and to the sides of the firing point.
  - The area to be kept clear on which falling residue from aerial fireworks is expected to drop which shall extend at least 100 m to the rear of the firing point.
  - No person shall smoke within the firing point.
  - No person under the age of 16 may discharge fireworks.
  - 4 x 9 kg Dry Chemical Powder fire extinguishers must be provided within the firing point.
  - All entrances and emergency exits must be identified and maintained.
  - Vehicles must be parked at least 100m away from the firing point.
  - Area to be patrolled by Law Enforcement/Metro Police/Fire Inspector.
  - No discharge of fireworks after 23:00 at night except on New Year's Eve.

The current 11 sites were implemented after the sub-councils considered the cost to the City and each line department, and the suitability of the sites in relation to the geographical layout of the City. There have been objections from sub-councils to the current sites, which therefore now require a review.

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
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
