LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SERVICES' QUARTERLY ACTIVITY REPORT FOR THE PERIOD 1 JULY TO 30 SEPTEMBER 2019.

5. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report provides an overview of the activities of the Library and Information Services Department (LIS) for the period 1 July to 30 September 2019.

7. DISCUSSION/CONTENTS

Making progress possible. Together.

The Department aims for excellence in providing a highly professional and cost-effective lending, reference and community information service. This report deals with the monitoring of service delivery.

7.1.1 Services

Two libraries issued block loans. Nazeema Isaacs Library issued books to lyabonga NGO and to Masimanyana Seniors Citizens club. Somerset West Library supplied books to four old age homes in the area – Huis Marie Louw, Helderberg Village, Robarie and Somerset Oaks.

Two libraries, Sir Lowry's Pass and Nazeema Isaacs, did outreach to informal settlements.

7.1.2 Programmes (Events and promotions)

An overview of new membership, circulation, gate readings and SmartCape usage at the libraries, as well as an analysis of the types of programmes and the number of attendees per programme per library is **attached** as Annexure A.

Sir Lowry's Pass Library celebrated Mandela day with three events. A coffee morning for seniors was held, and an extract from a Mandela book was read to the group. Storytelling was done with 24 children at Lathi-tha Day Care. The crèche was given a donation of colouring books, crayons, toys and play dough. Siyaphumelela Educare also visited the library with 30 children. Library staff had a games session with the group, playing Jenga, Lego, Spot it and Snakes and Ladders. Each child received a chocolate muffin and a goody bag

Macassar Library invited 25 elders to a Mandela Day celebration. They enjoyed treats and a reading of Mandela quotes.

Nazeema Isaacs Library partnered with Young Minds NGO to present a reading programme on Saturdays at the library. The focus was on reading and sharing what the children have read. The reading programme was very interactive, and the children were involved in various activities, including games. Nazeema Isaacs Library also held a reading programme with grade 6 learners from Noxolo Xauke Primary School. The focus was on reading for fun and with understanding.

An integrated storytime was held at Macassar Library in partnership with the subarea head. Twenty-three children from Sonskyn crèche attended it. The children enjoyed stories, colouring-inn and games in the library.

Sir Lowry's Pass Library partnered with IS&T and offered a digital literacy programme to nine unemployed women from the community. At the end of the session, the women could type their CVs and business letters.

Sir Lowry's Pass Library organized a book club for teens. The theme was issues affecting teens and books related to these issues were given to them. This was a very interesting session, as it allowed the teens to discuss matters affecting them.

National Book Week was celebrated from 2-7 September 2019. No fines were levied for that period if patrons returned late items. Sir Lowry's Pass reported that the response from the community was positive. A total of 37 books were returned, and three replacement cards were replaced at no cost.

7.1.3 Challenges / Successes

Somerset West Library has the 2nd highest circulation of items in the Western Cape.

SmartCape internet access for the public has not been available at Nazeema Isaacs Library since May 2019. This is due to cable theft in the area and the reluctance of Telkom to continually replace stolen cables. This is having a significant impact on the community who uses the library for internet access.

7.1.4 Repairs and maintenance

There were no major repairs or maintenance projects at any of the libraries.

7.1.5 Security
