Objection to the Application in terms of Section 6 of the City of Cape Town: Control of Undertakings that sell liquor to the Public (Bylaw 2013) ("the Liquor bylaw") for the extension of liquor trading hours from 2 to 4 am by CUBANA GREEN POINT ("the application")

- 1. The De Waterkant Civic Association has received extensive community commentary on this application and hereby strongly objects in terms of sec. 6(9)(e).(f).(g).(h) and (i) of the Liquor Bylaw 2013 and the motivation below to the granting of the application.
- 2. In 2017 the DWCA supported the extra security measures instituted by the Cubana owner, Mr. Stan Giger in response to various security problems emanating from Cubana Green Point. In 2018 the DWCA objected to the extended trading hours' application, yet Cubana nevertheless received their extended hours license.

3. This year, we have received extensive comments and objections from ratepayers and residents, business owners, community groups and investors in the De Waterkant area and we wish to consolidate these comments as follows for your consideration:

3.1 The DWCA opposes the granting of the extended trading hours license from 2 am to 4am in accordance with the national government aims to address the socio-economic impact of alcohol abuse and agreed policy norms and standards (as set out in the August 2016 Final Liquor Policy Paper and National Liquor Policy Review) which includes the recommendation that traders should bear liability for any harm or damages near the premises and to regulate the availability of liquor by restricting the trading hours and controlling access to liquor sales.

3.2 The application does not comply with the Liquor Bylaw criteria, nor with the 500 m distance required between schools, places of worship, residential areas and the prohibition of selling liquor at petrol service stations and premises near public transport. The distance between Cubana Green Point and the following institutions are noted:

a. School: 180 mb. BP garage: 100 m

c. Residential properties: **5-10 m**: Old Cape Quarter CQ1 - 55 residential apartments; Cape Quarter Living (CQ2) - 14 residential apartments; De Waterkant village 20m; 7,9,11 Jarvis streets (MU, residential upper level); all residential blocks in De Waterkant.

d. Parking garages: (i) Below CQ1: closed due to construction until 2020; Below CQ 2 - it closes late night and then is monitored by CQ security - regulated;
 32 Napier street - road and development;

3.2 Although business zoning and trading hours are a local government competency, the DWCA submits that the Western Cape provincial legislation in keeping with national legislation aligned objectives to regulate liquor trade and limit the potentially destructive socio-economic impact of liquor consumption leading to violence, crime, high risk sexual behaviours and road accidents (p. 17-22 of the Liquor Policy Paper sets out the statistics and consequences of the public health and negative socio-economic

effects of alcohol use, including neighbourhood disruption). This Policy recommends that local authorities need to ensure stricter licensing requirements and compliance with noise, nuisance and pollution, public health and safety considerations.

- 3.3 The DWCA submits that as a day-time and night-time trading entity, opening from 10am or 11am until 2am provides (16 hours) sufficient time in which to fairly conduct business. The extension of an additional 2 hours from 2am to 4am is not in in the public interest nor in pursuit of families or diners wishing to pop out for a meal or a drink it is to extend, in our view, the length of time for existing revellers at the premises. The anti-social behaviour we have witnessed and which have been reported to us counter the applicant's argument for an extra 2 hours of trading.
- 4. The DWCA submits that the application must be refused on the following grounds:
- 4.1 The antisocial behaviour by patrons leaving the Cubana venue is a major cause of concern for our residential, business communities and our ratepayers. There are serious social, criminal and environmental issues affecting De Waterkant residential area, besides noise impact. There have been reports of defecation and fornication in public in the residential area close to Cubana.
- 4.2 The applicant's motivation that Cubana is in a "totally surrounded [by] business area" omits/fails (and in our view manipulates) the fact that Cubana is in very close proximity to the historic De Waterkant residential area, opposite the Salesian Institute and the residential apartments upstairs in Cape Quarter (about 18m away in the building across the road).
- 4.3 The New Cape Quarter (CQ2) with 10 residential apartments and Old Cape Quarter (CQ1) of 55 residential apartments being built currently are not indicated in the application and the DWCA asks how these residential property rights are so glibly overlooked by the applicant?
- 4.4 The residential properties in Dixon Street, Waterkant Street and Loader Street bear the brunt of most of the observed anti-social behaviour, with people shouting, honking

of car hooters, screaming in the middle of the morning about where next they are going. Etc.

- 4.5 Parking remains a critical issue in the area: Two parking areas are mentioned in the application: 1 parking under CQ 1 (closed for renovation for possibly 12 months for the 55 Apartment development project) and CQ1 Parking both being paid parking. Naturally, Cubana patrons prefer parking in the free public parking in the small narrow, residential streets of De Waterkant. These historic, residential homes are homes situated close to the street, meaning no protection offered by gardens people's bedroom windows are also close to the street.
- 4.6 The anti-social/criminal behaviour complaints on record. There are media reports about shootings at Cubana which seem to indicate it is a risky place. These incidents and anti-social behaviour appear most prevalent in the early hours of the morning when alcohol consumption exacerbates the social and criminal conduct impact.

7. Page 9 in the application states:

- "The Granting of the extension in trading hours does not prejudice The residents of a residential area; As we have mentioned earlier that the applicant's previous applications for extension of trading hours has already been approved twice, and the applicant is currently trading till 04:00 legally till 24 November 2016. The applicant implement the necessary safety and strategy precautions' we mentioned in "Security and safety measures" later in this application, that will ensure that no inconvenience will be caused to any residents. The last 12 months there were no noise complaints on record against the applicant."
- 8. The DWCA rejects this view wholeheartedly. Whilst there might very well be no formal complaints lodged against Cubana, there are many instances of the antisocial behaviour and invasive, disruptive noise disturbances from patrons leaving his establishment in the early hours of the morning, people urinating against cars and homes, people fornicating in vehicles and people shouting and hooting at 4am. This

conduct by patrons from Cubana does prejudice the property and amenity rights of the residents and ratepayers in De Waterkant.

- 9. Also misrepresented in the application on pages 9-10 of the application are the following:
- 9.1. "As we mentioned above, it can be seen on the locality plan the applicant's business is located in a fully business area surrounded by businesses and we clearly indicated that there are dwelling located only at the rear of the building approximately +-100 Meters in Dixon street;" .and
- 9.2. "The nearest school is located more than 180 meters away, not in direct view and as we have mentioned before......; "and
- 9.3. "(The patients of an institution for drug or alcohol related dependencies; <u>There</u> are no patients of an institution for drug or alcohol related dependencies located near the applicant's venue. None of above institutions are located in the immediate are of the applicants 'premises or any direct view of the applicant's venue."
- 10. These statements (referred to above) are a distortion of the truth.
- 10.1. There are 15 residential apartments upstairs in Cape Quarter 2, just ±18m away in the building across the road. There are several cottages and houses just up Dixon Street, about 47m up the road, leading to Waterkant and Loader streets.
- 10.2. The Salesian Institute is directly across the Somerset Road, only 24m directly across. This property includes the Salesian Institute Youth Projects www.salesianyouth.org.za a non-profit organisation which works in youth education and skills development, changing the lives of vulnerable children and youth-at-risk in and around Cape Town (between 14 and 18 years of age). Learners are classed as at-risk adolescents which is defined as moderately and severely intellectually impaired learners, learners with behavioural issues, emotional problems, substance abuse, or poor socio-economic circumstances, for whom mainstream schooling is not appropriate.

- 10.3. The DWCA submits that the impression the applicant is trying to portray is managing a good, safe secure venue - but, regrettably, some Cubana patrons' behaviour negatively impact on the De Waterkant residential area.
- 10.4. On page 12 the application continues to state that the clientele has rights and that "freedom of choice is public Interest." The applicant's venue is mostly for the traditional Afrikaans "Lang arm" clientele. They are mostly in their late twenties till 55 years average. This is the Afrikaans people's way of life, this is what they are used to. This is also their culture that is, their shared beliefs, customs, values and language or dialect. There are only a few venues of that nature in the northern suburbs (Sic?) This venue has a fixed clientele and they clients feel save."
- 10.5. The DWCA submits that the Cubana customer base is not "a traditional Afrikaans "Lang arm" clientele" and the impression that a sedate, quiet "sokkie" happens at Cubana in Greenpoint is certainly not the case. Over the years, some published behaviour at Cubana included.
- 10.6. "A man has been killed and a second person wounded in Green Point, Cape Town, in what sources say was a fight linked to an ongoing nightclub security turf battle." Source News24.com https://www.news24.com/SouthAfrica/News/bouncer-stabbed-to-death-in-cape-town-underworld-club-security-battle-20171203;
- 10.7. "SA Football Players Union (Safpu) Safpu official accuses NFD club boss of punching him According to Mulaudzi, the incident occurred at a Cubana Café and eatery in Green Point, Cape Town on Saturday night." Source The Citizen Online:

10.8. "I have never been so angry. Very very disappointed by one of your bouncers! The way he chased&dragged me out of the club last night all because I was falling asleep??Really??! Couldn't he just tell me to leave instead embarrassing me as if I done something wrong to a point that he wanted to beat me wow!! Even worse it's not like I refused to leave I was leaving but he just pushed me out kept on telling him not to touch me because I have an operation on the hand he was touching! Chased me out like a dog wow!!! "

10.9. Further more, the Cubana clientele elsewhere where "2 people were shot & killed in Cubana nightclub in Stellenbosch last night as gunmen chased a male victim

- 10.10. Not published a few years back a patron left Cubana Greenpoint, to fetch his firearm in his parked car in Cape Quarter and shot at another patron in the street. This was reported to Marc Truss from CID.
- 11. The DWCA submits that these incidents indicate that the Cubana chain is not a "sokkie" venue." Every year, during the Jazz festival, marquees are erected on the Cubana parking space and huge parties take place for the Jazz revellers. Big events are also catered for the Mining Indaba. The DWCA supports well-managed events, but Cubana is not "an Afrikaans, sedate "Sokkie" venue. It is a party venue.
- 2. Below is a brief list of problems reported to the DWCA about disruptive, rowdy patrons. Several guesthouse owners and community members have sought assistance from the DWCA regarding issues of patrons leaving Cubana.

I have seen the application to extend the Cubana drinking licence to 4.00am and am writing to request that DWCA OBJECTS to this.

The residential nature of the Village is under sustained attack from constant development, extended entertainment hours, and full time Airbnb premises. Many of us no longer have neighbours, just a different face next door every morning. There is less and less peace during sleeping hours as entertainment establishments extend their drinking hours and progressively move outdoors. And the pace of development is transforming a Heritage area to the vulgarity of Dubai.

Please object strongly to this extended hours application.

- 7. Safety safeguards: The applicant explains in detail all the various safeguards he has implemented which the DWCA acknowledges. He has installed the cameras and has employed security guards for Cubana, but these measures are insufficient to prevent anti-social behaviour from drunk patrons leaving his establishment and disrupting the residential area.
- 8. Public Interest: The <u>DWCA does not believe</u> that operating until 4am is in our community's or the public interest. We allowed Cubana's first liquor trading hours' extension, but we submit that given the aftermath of what has been going on after 2am emanating from Cubana, the security measures put in place by Cubana are not enough to warrant extensive night-time disruption by anti-social behaviour of his patrons at 2-4 am and the impact on the nearby residential area.
- 9. Reasonable/Fair: We believe that a 2am license in this small residential area is fair provided there is <u>full compliance</u> with the applicable bylaws and that the residential area is not disrupted by Cubana trading and patrons' conduct, but we submit that the extension to 4 am is patently unreasonable and unfair. We contend that these two extra hours sought from 2-4 am are not for the benefit of late-night diners, but for already intoxicated revellers wanting to become even more intoxicated and leaving at 4am, walking around our homes, screaming, shouting, urinating and fornicating which is unlawful, unreasonable and unfair.

10. We submit that the following questions must also be considered when the nature of

such an establishment and the later, middle-of-the-night trading hours are taken into

account: is the extension of 2-4am an appropriate concession in the De Waterkant

historic, residential area with its tremendous tourism value and attraction to tourists

and visitors to Cape Town? Globally, where such unique and valued areas are fostered,

only suitable businesses/activities/developments are authorised. We believe De

Waterkant is one of those rare and valuable areas that require protection of the unique

heritage area versus the promotion of all-night entertainment establishments. There

are other areas within the City that permit and encourage late-night facilities, e.g Long

Street and Bree Street (where there are far fewer residences).

11. As custodians of one of the few remaining heritage, residential district areas in the

City centre, we strive to protect existing amenity and one of the City's principal

tourism assets. The DWCA submits that it isn't fair or reasonable to the residents

tourists and/or the community to endure drunk patrons and the anti-social behaviour

throughout the night. The DWCA believe that our request that Cubana Green Point

should close their doors 2am is reasonable and that the City should uphold our property





Replication: It make no sense what Leither mean by "blatantly ignoring their amended liquor license hours implemented by the Liquor Authorities". There is no amendments on the applicant's licence. The only amendments in 2012 was that the Municipality is deciding for trading hours after 02:00.

1.7 Objection NAME: SA Roux

We wish to strongly oppose the Application for the extension of Liquor trading hours for Cubana from 2am to 4am.

Cubana is located in an area that zoned residential and business and cause major noise and disturbance to the residential properties, and residence in the area. As proven in the past, establishments of this nature are totally disrespectful to their surrounding neighbours, by blatantly ignoring their amended liquor license hours implemented by the Liquor Authorities.

Windows and doors of the premises are kept open until early morning hours, music blaring, drunk patrons making a racket and keeping everyone awake in the surrounding area. When they finally close up shop, the drunken patrons make their way to their cars parked all over the village, laughing, shouting, screaming, blowing their car hooters and speeding off. The following morning the streets are littered with empty beer bottles and broken glass.

This results in complaints from guests. Some don't mention anything to management or staff, and sadly the first time we get to hear of it is through trip advisor or booking.com reviews.

The worst-case scenario is that guests insist to be moved to another room, and unfortunately this is not always possible during busy periods, therefore resulting in early departures, refunds and bad reviews.

Replication Mr Roux has a licenced Guest House" and this is a business objection which Mr Roux is a licence holder, and object for his own benefit.

Mr Bannister never explain on which how exactly Cubana is affecting his business directly, but merely as the residents.

Mr Roux mention "Windows and doors of the premises are kept open until early morning hours, music blaring, drunk patrons making a racket and keeping everyone awake in the surrounding area. "Cubana has no windows, and this is clear that he is confused with another premises, and he did not explain how he can determent how the noise is generated from Cabana. No sound can be heard from Cubana, from Java Street and further.

Thee are no record of any complaints lodged in that area at all.

1.8 **Objection; NAME:** The De Waterkant Civic Association

Replication:

First of all, the objector hired an Attorney to motivate his objection. This is highly irregular to hire somebody to motivate an objection.

The distances the Attorney mentioned, eg.

Residential properties: 5-10 m. - The pavement of Somerset road is 10 meters away from the door. How can a house (Java Street)be possibly, 5-10 away. There is no 500-meter rule that exist. Even if this did exist, what is the rule.

He mentioned By Laws. But he never mentioned what the By Laws is all about. Our whole application is motivated around security measures which the By Laws demands.

His mentioning of previous complaints in this column, was already dealt with in 2015, and he took all the names out, which makes this highly suspicious. The emails he presented, was without names, which can just as much be fabricated.

The (CQ1) of 55 residential apartments he mentioned, is only in the building process and not yet complete. No residents are even staying there now.

This objection is fabricated, and false.

Information he speaks about "Sokkie" is not accurate at all, this was a mentioning of similar places that was dealt with by Council in the past.

If the objector wrote his own objection, the facts could have been more relevant, but this is proof that, this attorney, is not familiar with the area at all.

We trust that the Sub Council will find abovementioned in order.
