Mr Monk requests that the Cllrs provide a list of proposed schools, Old Age Homes and Health Care facilities within their Wards. **ACT WORKSHOP** Mr Monk highlighted the MURP areas as Vrygrond, Seawinds and Lavender Hill. He further advised that the Clirs identify what lives in the area and its needs. Ald Rau stated that the Cllrs would need to: identify the crime and grime, engage the community translate their findings to a Community Action Plan (CAP) Arrange a briefing meeting with Cllrs and officials Ald Rau added that a Mayoral Urban Regeneration Committee (MURC) derives from the MURP projects which discusses the MURP minute from each Subcouncil. This committee is chaired by the Mayor to hold the Mayco members of each directorate accountable for progress on these projects. Ald advised that Subcouncil would need to establish whether this committee has been formed as yet and what the proposed meeting schedule is. She added that this would with identifying timeframes.
