

# THE FINAL RESTING PLACE

## Earth To Earth

If burial is the preferred choice for interment, the City of Cape Town recommends plain, unlined wooden coffins as the most eco-friendly vessel for the natural decay of the body. Simple cotton shrouds are permitted in designated grounds in line with other religious practices.



### Private Graves

#### Full monumental graves (private)

- Laid head-to-head, flanked by pathways
- Personalised memorial works
- Allow second burial
- Most expensive option

#### Berm burials (private)

- Demarcated by headstones
- Aesthetically pleasing
- Offer cost and space savings
- Allow second or third burials

### Non-private graves

#### Public graves (non-private)

- Space for two coffins from unrelated families
- No permanent memorial works permitted
- Affidavits from next of kin are required to accept specific conditions
