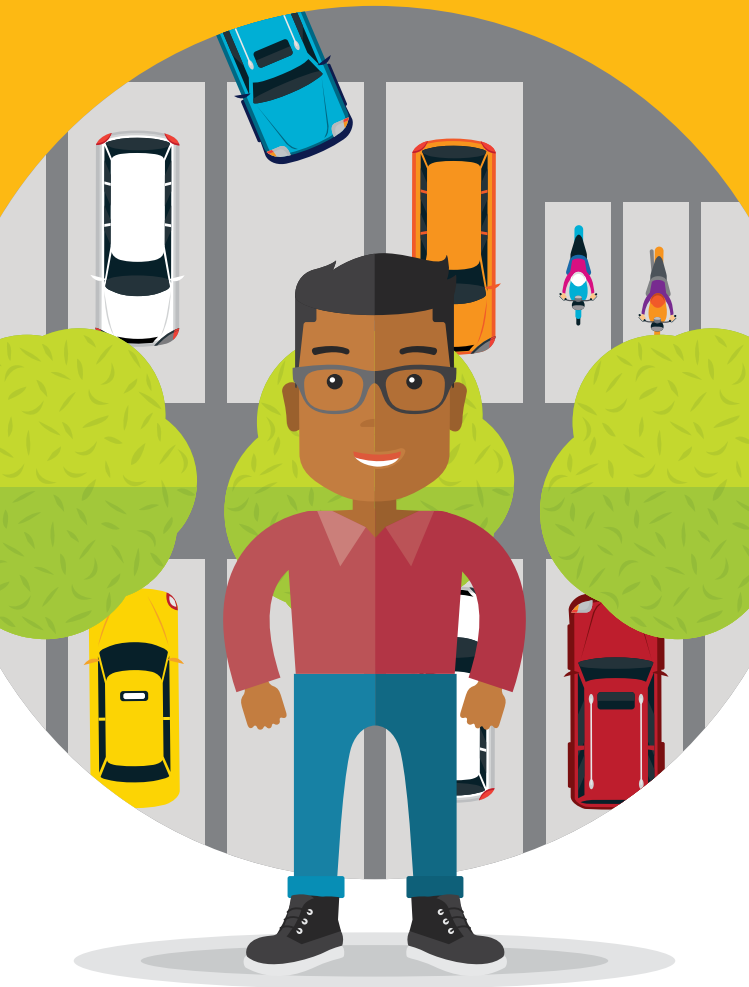


YOUR GUIDE TO PARKING MANAGEMENT

Charging fees for parking is common practice in cities across the world to allow as many people as possible to access parking in popular areas where space is limited and the demand for parking is high.

The City of Cape Town administers a managed parking system to:

- Ensure fair access to parking for all.
- Support the economic viability of business districts by facilitating short-term parking.
- Ensure efficient use of public spaces and reduce congestion.



WHERE DOES THE CITY MANAGE PARKING?

The City manages parking in the following areas:

- Cape Town CBD (including Kloof Street)
- Sea Point
- Bellville
- Claremont
- Newlands
- Kenilworth
- De Waterkant

Ongoing monitoring is under way in Durbanville, Salt River, Woodstock, Green Point, Camps Bay, Muizenberg, Fish Hoek, Simon's Town and Gardens.



HOW DOES PARKING WORK?

- **Upfront payment:** Payment must be made before leaving the vehicle.
- **Smart meters:** Parking marshals use mobile smart meters to record vehicle registration and parking bay numbers.
- **Incremental charges:** Parking fees are calculated in 15-minute increments, e.g. if a motorist parks for 10 minutes, a minimum charge of 15 minutes applies.
- **Payment methods:** Cash, SnapScan, debit card or credit card.
- **No refunds:** Motorists must adhere to official parking-duration signage.
- **Receipts:** Marshals have receipt books and can provide receipts immediately. There is an option for a weekly or monthly printout of parking activities for a small administration fee.

HOURS OF OPERATION

- Weekdays: 08:00 to 17:00
- Saturdays: 08:00 to 13:00
- Sundays: Parking is free
- After-hours, Sundays and public holidays: Parking is not charged



LONG-STAY PARKING

Motorists in the CBD can also access long-stay parking in privately operated parking garages or on-street parking on the edge of the business district, where parking is either free or cheaper.

Motorists in the Cape Town CBD can also access long-stay parking along the following streets on the fringes of the Cape Town CBD:

- Jan Smuts Street
- Sir Lowry Road between Tennant and Darling streets
- DF Malan Street
- Buitengracht Street
- Tariffs will apply as follows:
- For less than 4,5 hours: R30
- Between 4,5 and 9 hours: R50

FUTURE AREAS

The City will communicate new areas and commencement dates for new parking management implementations as and when these are confirmed.
