REPLY FROM THE EXECUTIVE MAYOR TO QUESTION FROM CLLR P HEYNES FOR COUNCIL MEETING 28 APRIL 2016

On 9 March 2016 the Cabinet of the Western Cape Provincial Parliament (Western Cape Government) authorised the de-proclamation of various pieces of land on the subject property commonly known as "Farm Driftsands and Driftsands Nature Reserve".

As part of the de-proclamation, the property is envisaged for housing to develop a sustainable and integrated settlement.

Subsequent to the de-proclamation the Western Cape Government has donated the subject property to the City of Cape Town. The deed of alienation by virtue of the acceptance of the property as a donation has been initiated by the City for the various unregistered portions for housing purposes.

On Wednesday 20 April 2016 I met with the communities of Sophakama, Los Angeles and Green Park informal settlements living at Driftsands to inform them of the current status.
