EXTENSION OF LIQUOR TRADING HOURS APPLICATION: IN RESPECT OF: WCP014515/A:- SUPER SPAR, VICTORIA ROAD, HOUT BAY (OFF CONSUMPTION - MONDAYS TO SATURDAYS)

3. PURPOSE

To report to the Subcouncil on comments received for a liquor license application in terms of Section 37 of the Western Cape Liquor Act, 2008, as amended by the Western Cape Liquor Amendment Act, 10 of 2010 and Western Cape Liquor Regulations, 2011 pertaining to the Extension of Trading Days and Hours applicable to Section 6(5)A of the City of Cape Town Liquor Trading Days and Hours By-Law 2013 as amended.

4. FOR DECISION BY

Delegation Part 25-4 (2) To approve, refuse or vary applications for extension of trading days and hours on premises where liquor licenses have been granted

5. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Liquor Trading Days and Hours By-Law, 2010 as amended by the Liquor Trading Days and Hours By-law, 2012 requires that the needs of the community and the liquor license holder are considered by following due administrative processes. The application before Subcouncil 20 is at the stage where public participation was facilitated by the administration of Subcouncil and the comments from the affected stake holders are attached for the Subcouncil to approve, refuse or vary the application for the extension of trading days and hours, Mondays to Saturdays from 18H00 until 20H00 for Consumption OFF premises applicable to the business trading as Super Spar, Victoria Road, Hout Bay.

6. DISCUSSION

- 6.1 Section 37 of the Western Cape Liquor Act, 2008, as amended by the Western Cape Liquor Amendment Act, 10 of addresses the Notice of Application process. Section 37(4), (5) and (6) of the Act reads as follows:
- "(4) The designated liquor officer in whose area of jurisdiction the proposed licensed premises are located must, within the prescribed period from the date of lodgement of an application, serve a copy of the application in the prescribed manner on the municipality concerned in order for it to—
- (a) where section 36(1)(c) applies—
- (i) allow the public to have access to, inspect or, upon payment of the prescribed fee, obtain a copy of the application;
- (ii) obtain the comment of the ward councillor;
- (iii) comment on the application; and
- (iv) allow for the consideration of the planning application in relation to the application for a liquor licence; or
- (b) where section 36(1)(c) does not apply—
 - (i) allow the public to have access to, inspect or, upon payment of the prescribed fee, obtain a copy of the application;
 - (ii) obtain comment of the ward councillor; and
 - (iii) comment on the application.
- (5) The designated liquor officer in whose area of jurisdiction the proposed licensed premises are located must or the municipality may, within the prescribed time, give notice of the application to—
 - (a) neighbouring residents or such persons who in his, her or its judgement may be affected by, or have an interest in, the granting or refusal of the application; and
 - (b) the community policing forum, if any, of the area in which the premises are located.
- (6) Notwithstanding subsection (1), where an applicant has to comply with section 36(1)(c), the notification done in terms of the applicable planning legislation is deemed to be in compliance with the notification requirements in terms of this section: Provided that the Liquor Licensing Tribunal may require such additional notification as it may deem appropriate."

7. RECOMMENDATION

Subcouncil 20 recommends that the application for a liquor licence received from Super Spar, Victoria Road, Hout bay, Reference No WCP014515/A:- for the extension of trading days and hours Mondays to Saturdays, 18H00 until 20H00 for Consumption OFF Premises, be APPROVED, REFUSED or VARIED.

If Not Supported, Note the following grounds for disqualification.

Criteria for granting licences

- 31.(1) The Liquor Licensing Tribunal or Presiding Officer, as the case may be, <u>may not grant a licence</u>, unless it or he or she is satisfied on the balance or probabilities that -
- (a) the granting thereof is in the public interest;
- (b) the applicant is of good character, and not disqualified from holding a licence in terms of section 35;
- (c) the premises on which the sale or consumption of liquor will take place are or will upon completion be suitable for use by the applicant for the purposes of the licence;
- (d) the applicant has the right to occupy the proposed licensed premises; and
- (e) the granting of the application does not prejudice -
 - (i) the residents of a residential area;
 - (ii) the residents of an institution for the aged or frail;
 - (iii) the learners of an educational institution who are under the age of eighteen (18) years;
 - (iv) the patients of an institution for drug or alcohol related dependencies; or
 - (iv) the congregants of a religious institution located in the vicinity of the proposed licensed premises."

Reasons for Non Support:

The granting of the application prejudices-

- (i) the residents of a residential area;
- (ii) the residents of an institution for the aged or frail;
- (iii) the learners of an educational institution who are under the age of eighteen (18) years;
- (iv) the patients of an institution for drug or alcohol related dependencies; or
- (i) the congregants of a religious institution located in the vicinity of the proposed licensed premises."

APPLICATION IN TERMS OF SECTION 6 OF THE CITY OF CAPE TOWN: CONTROL OF UNDERTAKINGS THAT SELL LIQUOR TO THE PUBLIC, 2013 FOR MONDAY TO SATURDAY OFF-CONSUMPTION TRADING

Introduction

- All Local Authorities, in this case the City of Cape Town, have a mandate in terms of section 156 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, act nr 108 of 1996 to make and administer by-laws for the effective administration of matters which it has the right to administer. In this case, trading hours and days for undertakings that sells liquor to the public.
- 2. This mandate was acknowledged by the Western Cape Liquor Act, Act Nr 4 of 2008 as amended and more specifically section 59 of the above act. In the case of the City of Cape Town, a by-law was published in 2010 and amended in 2012 and was due to be implemented on 1 April 2013. On 27 March 2013 (days before implementation) the by-law was referred back to the EEST portfolio committee to be reconsidered. This resulted in a publication of "Draft by-law for the Controlling of Undertakings that Sell Liquor to the Public, 2013". In the request for inputs from affected parties and by initiating the above process, the City Council acknowledged the fact that although alcohol is no ordinary commodity, unduly restricted supply (sales) have been shown to have adverse side-effects on individuals and businesses. Hence, it is necessary to seek a careful balance between the permitted times and hours of opening as well as the responsibilities of individuals using alcohol and those undertaking selling alcohol to the public.
- 3. The resultant new public by-law is more comprehensive and contains a number of new provisions in order to accomplish objectives to suit and satisfy all parties. The draft by-law also allows for the application for extension of trading days and hours within certain limits.

Personnel compliment and implications regarding HR & Labour Legislation

4. The outcome of this application for extended hours of sale will definitively have an effect on personnel compliment of this retailer. The outcome of this application will also no doubt have an effect on the amount of casual workers employed by this retailer. 5. In order to conform to Labour Legislation, staff can only work a certain amount of hours per week. If extended off consumption trading hours (and proposed Sunday trading) will become a reality, more personnel can be employed – to work more weekly shifts, thus staying within the parameters of Labour Legislation.

Commuters making use of public transport

- 6. In the case of commuters residing in outlying areas and making use of unreliable public transport, it is a known fact that after 18h00 (when liquor stores close) there are still a number of trains, busses and taxi's arriving at these destinations. This resulted in commuters having to purchase liquor illegally. It must be born in mind that many people purchase liquor on a daily basis, as this is the best way of controlling liquor consumption. In most cases, liquor purchased on a specific day will be consumed on that day. Weekly purchases made on a Saturday morning (for the week) will result in over indulgence over the weekend. Therefore DAILY CONVENIENT purchases of liquor is very important to all people and even more so for people using public transport. Hout Bay is a very good example of the situation described above. This retailer is placed between the public transport and residential area.
- 7. Should a commuter not be able to purchase liquor on arrival at his destination, it will be an option to purchase liquor at a point of boarding public transport. One needs not embroid on the hazardous situation of transporting liquor via public transport. Another option will be to purchase liquor from illegal traders after arriving at destination.

Tourism aspect affecting liquor retailing

8. It is reported from all sources that the Western Cape Tourism is busy to recover from the Covid-19 pandemic and the result thereof. It is foreseen that the estimated contribution of tourism to the Western Cape economy will once again be at least 10% of economic activity as it was before Covid. It is therefore of very high importance that tourists to the Western Cape (not only from the rest of South Africa, but also from abroad) be afforded ample time to do purchases, which obviously include purchases of alcoholic beverages. It is difficult for a tourist to understand why the shelves and refrigerators in a modern supermarket at some

times are locked when they intend also purchasing wine and other alcoholic beverages for consumption at their holiday home or accommodation.

9. All the big supermarket groups spend a large amount of money on marketing campaigns to promote the wines and the wine routes of the Western Cape only to find that people shopping in supermarkets or shopping centres, end up in front of locked wine areas or locked liquor shops. The Western Cape is very fortunate to enjoy the portion of the tourist market that visit the Western Cape. It must, however, be noted that due to the economic climate, the tourist season is becoming shorter. Also for that reason the availability of all merchandise not only during this season, is very important for retailers in the Western Cape and specifically the Cape Peninsula and coastal areas.

Customer count in the retail environment

- 10. No matter what the reason is, it is a known fact that the customer count of supermarkets and shopping malls, big and small, showed that preferred time of shopping of all commodities is between 17h00 and closing time. Should some departments and/or shops have to close earlier, it will no doubt inconvenience the shopper and also have an impact on the sales of the retailer. It is also a well-known fact that when the so-called grocers wine licenses were introduced years ago in contrary to predictions, the same amount of wine was sold but only in more outlets.
- 11. In other words, the granting by the authorities of grocers' wine licenses did not increase the volume of wine sold in South Africa.

Other retailers in the area

12. Retailers nearby this retailer are already enjoying extended off consumption trading days and hours. Should this application not be approved, this retailer will trade at a disadvantage and potential customers will travel, or in this instance, walk to nearby outlets to make liquor purchases. It is therefore of the utmost importance that this application be approved. Should this application not be approved, the possibility of drinking and driving will be a reality.

Western Cape Liquor Act

13. Should this application be approved, it will still be inside the parameters set by the Western Cape Liquor Act, Nr 4 of 2008 as amended in section 59 of the act. The retailer will not experience longer sales hours as a result of this application being approved. Proposed regulations published by the National Liquor Authority also calls for uniform trading hours throughout the Republic of South Africa. Should this be achieved, there will not be certain retailers that are given preferential treatment.

By-Law: City of Cape Town - Control of Undertakings that Sell Liquor to the Public 2013

14. In keeping with and following of other legislators, the City of Cape Town in this By-Law also do not differentiate between days of the week and all days of the week are treated equal as to avoid giving preference to certain religious or cultural groups. It is also noticeable that the Western Cape Liquor Act, follows the same ruling.

Section 6(9) of the By-Law

15. As requested in the above section, we comment as follows:

(a) Validity of the liquor licence

Kindly note comments by Specialized Law Enforcement.

(b) Business licence

In this instance a business licence is not required for the sale of wine

(c) Location category as per schedule

In this instance, not applicable

(d) Previous suspension amendment or revocation of extended trading days & hours, including previous records of complaints investigated and confirmed in respect of the last 12 months preceding a current application for extension.

Not applicable. The retailer has never been served with a compliance notice, amendments or a suspension of a grant in terms of this By-Law and is still trading under current extension until 6 December 2024. This application serves to renew the current grant for extension.

(e) Proximity of licensed premises to surrounding residential zoned area

Kindly see attached Google map of the area. It needs to be noted that in the immediate vicinity of this supermarket there are other retailers enjoying extended days and hours of trading.

(f) Outcome of community consultation

As far as applicant is concerned, there has never been any negative comment as a result of community consultation to his application.

(g) The potential impact on the surrounding environment

Judging from previous trading of the applicant, there has been no impact on the surrounding environment. (Also see attached report by Specialized Law Enforcement).

(h) Public interest

In many reported and unreported cases the public interest is in most cases the deciding factor when a liquor licence is granted by a Liquor Authority and the conditions thereto are laid down.

According to the decision of the High Court of South Africa, public interest is doing something which if done, better serves the public than when not done.

All Liquor Boards in the Republic of South Africa, be it on a National or on a Provincial level, is regularly reminded of the article by Dr Malcolm Averey in De Rebus of May 1991, page 353 and 354 where it is specifically mentioned that the convenience of the public will be in most cases the deciding factor when considering the public interest and the granting of licences.

Applicant therefore submits that although published already in 1991, the statement made by the late Dr Averey still holds good and is definitely still applicable.

Applicant furthermore submits, taking the above into account, the granting of this application for longer business hours, will no doubt be in the public interest as it will also convenience the public.

In this instance, as mentioned above, and previous performance of this retailer, the approved additional trading days and hours, in this instance, will also no doubt be in the public interest.

(i) Motivation from the applicant dealing with the impact of risk to and nuisance on the surrounding communities

The granting of this application will not impact the surrounding community with additional risks and nuisance. As mentioned above, this retailer is currently enjoying extension of hours and days of trading until 6 December 2024 and the renewal of this grant will not have an impact on risk and nuisance on the surrounding community as is the case at the moment.

16. The Spar Guild and Spar South Africa

This retailer is also like other store owners trading under the Spar and Tops banner, a member of the Spar Guild. Spar South Africa has the right to trade under the Spar

banner in South Africa and Namibia. The Spar Guild set standards to which its members of applicant, in this instance, must comply with. These standards are in many aspects significantly higher in respect of Spar outlets, namely those set in the various Liquor Acts in South Africa.

Should the applicant not comply with the standards set by the latter, it runs the risk of its membership to the Spar Guild being terminated and thus being unable to further conduct business.

Mitigation measures to assist the control of risks and nuisances

Mitigation measures to assist retailer, which is a responsible retailer with a good reputation, it is submitted that products to be stocked by this supermarket will not be low priced products and will not attract unsavoury elements, as is the case with illegal retailers in the area. Investigation has shown that people drinking in public and open public areas, do not consume the products stocked by this reputable and responsible retailer. In many cases the product consumed by these people are sourced from illegal traders.

Benefits to surrounding community

Benefits of extended wine trading hours and days on the surrounding community will be as described above: that wine purchases can be made at a convenient time and on a daily basis to cater for daily needs. Also people making use of public transport, which as we all know, is insecure and not regulated, will have the chance to purchase liquor from a reputable and responsible retailer at a fair price.

Security measures implemented by retailer

- A burglar alarm with panic buttons is in place and an armed response unit is employed
- Armed response also patrols the area on a 24-hour basis (ADT)
- > In total 80 cameras in place monitoring the area on a 24-hour basis

- > Also 2 full time security guards from Deep Blue Patrol on 12-hour shifts
- > Also 3 loss control guards on duty per day


