### 4. DISCUSSION

This report presents the annual performance of the Directorate in respect of EPWP targets set for the 2019/20 Financial Year and measures undertaken in light of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Following the worldwide outbreak of the Covid19 pandemic, the President of the Republic of South Africa on 26 March 2020 announced the national government's decision to impose a National Lockdown as a mitigation measure against the uncontrolled spread of the virus.

As a result of the National Lockdown Restrictions, Human Settlements was negatively affected in performing its routine operations as well as the implementation of capital projects and programmes for completion during the 2019/2020. Hence, mitigation measures were proposed during early May 2020.

The request for the proposed review and amendment of annual targets mainly due to the negative impact of the Covid19 Lockdown restrictions on all line department's operations was accepted and approved by the Manager: EPWP.

As alluded to in the preliminary progress report previously submitted to the committee, a request to address an "administrative flaw" pertaining to the re-alignment of EPWP targets that transpired during the handover/reconfiguration of operational functions between the respective line departments mainly due to the reintegration of the Informal Settlement department into the Human Settlement Directorate were sent to the Executive Director: Water and Waste.

Despite the aforementioned efforts made by line to try and address the issue, the Executive Director: Water and Waste did not support the request for the transfer of 600 job opportunities created and reported for by the Janitorial Services branch to the department Informal Settlements and Backyarders mainly due to potential audit implications that the request may pose especially on the National Reporting System for EPWP. Following liaison with the EPWP Corporate office and the Organisational Performance Management department to seek advice on the potential audit implications on the National Reporting System as well as the annual Auditor General audit, Human Settlements was advised that Water and Waste concerns raised were fair and reasonable and that changes to targets and annual performance already reported to various forums, committees and reporting structures may results in audit findings. Hence, this coupled with the unforeseen impact of the Covid19 pandemic had a significant negative impact on the Directorates annual performance against targets as indicated below.

The final results on performance against EPWP targets for the Human Settlements directorate as at 30 June 2020 is as follows.

The Committee raised the matter of employment of EPWP workers during the initial lockdown to undertake essential services.

Only the Ward funded EPWP workers who already had contracts at the start of the lockdown and were offering an essential service were allowed to continue working during the lockdown until the end of June (end of approved PID). These workers were issued with permits and their contracts expired at the end of June.

The mayoral job creation program which was to award new contracts from March to June was unable to effect the appointment of EPWP workers due to the following:

- Once we went on lockdown admin staff who coordinate the appointment of EPWP via the randomization office were not regarded as essential workers
- The City also had challenges with non-availability or shortage of PPE even for our internal staff which meant we could not issue new PPE to additional EPWP and had we continued we could have exposed the workers to unsafe working conditions and the City to risk of litigation.

Human Settlement Directorate EPWP targets 2020/2021

It should be noted that the annual targets for the Directorate for the 2020/2021 have been re-aligned to eliminate further complexities with reporting against targets in the 2020/2021 and ensuing financial years. The targets as accepted by the responsible line Directors and the Executive Director: Human Settlements are therefore as per the breakdown below:
