APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF LIQUOR TRADING HOURS IN RESPECT OF: SECRETS, 229C LONG STREET, CAPE TOWN, ON CONSUMPTION: 02:00-04:00

3. PURPOSE

To decide on an application for extension of liquor trading hours in terms of Section 6(1) of the City of Cape Town: Control of Undertakings that Sell Liquor to the Public By-Law, 2013

4. FOR DECISION BY

SubCouncil in terms of Delegation 4(2)

To approve, refuse or vary applications for extension of trading hours on premises where liquor licences have been granted.

5. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The City of Cape Town: Control of Undertakings that Sell Liquor to the Public By-Law, 2013, was promulgated on 17 January and coming into effect on 01 February 2014.

An application for extension of liquor trading hours in terms of Section 6 (1) of the By-law was submitted to the Health Directorate and circulated to the relevant departments for comment. The fully signed application, including all required comments was submitted to the SubCouncil 16 Manager, and was then circulated to abutting neighbours, all organisations included on the Ward 115 database and ward committee members for comment.

Clause 9 of the By-law requires that the City must, before approving an application for the extension of trading days and hours, reasonably and fairly consider further factors which must include, inter alia-

- (a) the validity of the liquor licence;
- (b) where applicable, the validity of a business licence issued in terms of the Businesses Act of 1991 (Act No. 71 of 1991);

- (c) location category as per the Schedule;
- (d) previous suspension, amendment or revocation of extended trading days and hours including previous records of complaints investigated and confirmed in respect of the last twelve months preceding a current application for extension;
- (e) the proximity of the licensed premises to surrounding residential zoned area, cultural, religious and educational facilities;
- (f) outcome of community consultation and the recommendation of the relevant ward:
- (g) the potential impact on the surrounding environment;
- (h) whether it is in the public interest to approve and grant an extension of trading days or hours; or
- (i) a motivation from the applicant dealing with the impact of
 - (i) the risks to and nuisances on the surrounding community;
 - (ii) mitigation measures to assist the control of risks and nuisances; and
 - (iii) possible benefits of extended liquor trading hours and days on the surrounding community.
- (10) The basis and rationale behind all decision-making must be recorded.

6. DISCUSSION

- 6.1 Section 6 (1) of the By-Law reads as follows:
 6(1) Subject to subsection (5), (6) and (7) a licensee may upon payment of the required fee, submit a written application to the City to extend the liquor trading days and hours of licensed premises.



APPLICATION IN TERMS OF SECTION 6 OF THE CITY OF CAPE TOWN: CONTROL OF UNDERTAKINGS THAT SELL LIQUOR TO THE PUBLIC, 2013 FOR MONDAY TO SUNDAY ON-CONSUMPTION TRADING

Introduction

- All Local Authorities, in this case the City of Cape Town, have a mandate in terms of section 156 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, act nr 108 of 1996 to make and administer by-laws for the effective administration of matters which it has the right to administer. In this case, trading hours and days for undertakings that sells liquor to the public.
- 2. This mandate was acknowledged by the Western Cape Liquor Act, Act Nr 4 of 2008 as amended and more specifically section 59 of the above act. In the case of the City of Cape Town, a by-law was published in 2010 and amended in 2012 and was due to be implemented on 1 April 2013. On 27 March 2013 (days before implementation) the by-law was referred back to the EEST portfolio committee to be reconsidered. This resulted in a publication of "Draft by-law for the Controlling of Undertakings that Sell Liquor to the Public, 2013". In the request for inputs from affected parties and by initiating the above process, the City Council acknowledged the fact that although alcohol is no ordinary commodity, unduly restricted supply (sales) have been shown to have adverse side-effects on individuals and businesses. Hence, it is necessary to seek a careful balance between the permitted times and hours of opening as well as the responsibilities of individuals using alcohol and those undertaking selling alcohol to the public.
- The resultant public by-law is comprehensive and contains a number of provisions in order to accomplish objectives to suit and satisfy all parties. The by-law allows for the application for extension of trading days and hours within certain limits.

Personnel compliment and implications regarding HR & Labour Legislation

4. In order to conform to Labour Legislation, staff can only work a certain amount of hours per week. If proposed extended hours are approved, it will no doubt affect the personnel compliment of this establishment. Should this application be approved, it will definitely result in more permanent as well as temporary job opportunities.

Tourism aspect affecting liquor retailing

5. It is reported from all sources that the Western Cape Tourism have recovered to pre Covid-19 levels and the result thereof. It is foreseen that the estimated contribution of tourism to the Western Cape economy will once again be at least 10% of economic activity as it was before Covid. It is therefore of very high importance that tourists to the WesternCape (not only from the rest of South Africa, but also from abroad) be afforded ample time to patronize tourist facilities, such as applicant's establishment.

The Honourable Sub-council needs no introduction to the Long Street area and is no doubt aware of the part this area plays in the tourism of Cape Town. It is also recognized that a number of establishments similar to applicant's establishment are already enjoying trading until 4:00. It is therefore respectfully requested that this establishment aithough new to Long Street be granted the opportunity to trade until 4:00 and to prove to Sub-council that they are responsible traders.

The Cape Town CBD

6. As mentioned, Long Street is a very popular area of entertainment in the Cape Town area, but equally important is the rest of the Cape Town CBD. It is submitted that Long Street and the rest of the adjoining Cape Town CBD and the V & A Waterfront compliment one another as they offer equally important entertainment to visitors to Cape Town.

Other business activities in the area

7. Besides for a number of licensed premises in the Long Street area, there are also other businesses of all description and size and this area can very well be called the heart of business activity in Cape Town.

Western Cape Liquor Act

8. Should this application be approved, it will still be inside the parameters set by the Western Cape Liquor Act, Nr 4 of 2008 as amended in section 59 of the Act. The retailer will not experience longer sales hours as a result of this application being approved.

By-Law: City of Cape Town — Control of Undertakings that Sell Liquor to the Public 20

9. In keeping with and following of other legislators, the City of Cape Town in this By-Law also do not differentiate between days of the week and all days of the week are treated equal as to avoid giving preference to certain religious or cultural groups. It is also noticeable that the Western Cape Liquor Act, follows the same ruling.

Section 6(9) of the By-Law

- 10. As requested in the above section, we comment as follows:
 - (a) Validity of the liquor licence

(b) Business Licence

(c) Location category as per schedule

In this instance not applicable as zoning is in order for trading as requested.

(d) Previous suspension amendment or revocation of extended trading days & hours, including previous records of complaints investigated and

(e) confirmed in respect of the last 12 months preceding a current application for extension.

Not applicable. The licenced holder has never had amendments or a suspension or revocation of extended trading days and hours or any record of complaints investigated.

(f) Proximity of licensed premises to surrounding residential zoned area

Kindly see attached Google map of the area. As this is very much a mixed-use area, it is very difficult to pinpoint residential areas in proximity of this licensed establishment. It is also respectfully submitted that the chances are very good that some of the premises used for a residential purposes is not zoned for that purpose.

(g) Outcome of community consultation

This licensee only recently opened its doors and no history is available.

(h) The potential impact on the surrounding environment

As mentioned, this establishment only recently started trading and received a Liquor Licence. No doubt however, looking at the businesses next door and in close proximity of this licensed business, there will be no impact on the surrounding environment.

(i) Public interest

In many reported and unreported cases the public interest is in most cases the deciding factor when a liquor licence is granted by a Liquor Authority and the conditions thereto are laid down.

According to the decision of the High Court of South Africa, public Interest is doing something which if done, better serves the public than when not done.

All Liquor Boards in the Republic of South Africa, be it on a National or on a Provincial level, is regularly reminded of the article by Dr Malcolm Averey in De Rebus of May 1991, page 353 and 354 where it is specifically mentioned that the convenience of the public will be in most cases the deciding factor when considering the public interest and the granting of licences.

Applicant therefore submits that although published already in 1991, the statement made by the late Dr Averey still holds good and is definitely still applicable.

Applicant furthermore submits, taking the above into account, the granting of this application for longer business hours, will no doubt be in the public interest as it will also convenience the public.

In this instance, as mentioned above, the approved additional trading hours, will also no doubt be in the public interest.

(j) Motivation from the applicant dealing with the impact of risk to and nuisance on the surrounding communities

The granting of this application will not impact the surrounding community with additional risks and nuisance. As mentioned above, the retailer has only recently opened its doors and is right in the centre of other retailers offering the same business as the applicant. It is therefore safe to say that this application will not have an impact on risk and nulsance on the surrounding community as is the case at the moment.

(j) Mitigation measures to assist the control of risks and nuisances

Benefits to surrounding community

Benefits to the surrounding community will be the offering of a bigger choice to a person visiting the Cape Town CBD and the Long Street area. Visitors to this area, be it locals or tourist, will now have the choice of another venue to patronize.

Security measures implemented by retailer
