The Community Services and Health Directorate, City Health Department: Area South (Southern) is reporting on the quarterly progress made on its business plan for the period July to September 2019.

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

8. DISCUSSION/CONTENTS

Background:

The City seeks to provide a healthy environment to its citizens. In Sub Council 20 these services are offered from two offices based in Wynberg, Lakeside and a support service in Plumstead. Environmental Health (Municipal Health Services) is one of the core businesses for City Health in the Community Services and Health Directorate within the City. A number of indicators are used to measure progress and performance for environment, but the report will focus mainly on key indicators. Performance on other indicators is available on request.

Drinking Water Quality: There is a total of 17 main sampling points located within the Sub-Council. Weekly samples are taken at these 17 points and for the period under review 100% compliance for Bacteriological standards was observed, thus exceeding the target of 99% for the Sub Council. These samples are taken at strategic points linked to the end users.

Access to basic services in Informal Settlements: There are 2 Informal Settlements located in this area. Weekly monitoring visits are conducted by environmental health practitioners (EHP). For the period under review the EHP's have completed a total of 150 monitoring visits. Environmental Health practitioners engage with other relevant service departments should the need arise in order to address basic service needs.

Vector control: Vectors are responsible for carrying various illnesses from one place to the other, therefore their control and management is important. The number of block baiting stations for controlling rats reached was 174.

Health Fromotion

A total of 9 Health and Hygiene projects has been undertaken by Environmental Health Practitioners and Environmental Health Assistants for the period under review at Early Childhood Development Centres and Informal Settlements.

Special Operations

Environmental Health Practitioners identified areas where warning signage relating to inland water needed to be erected, this programme has commenced and is ongoing.

Domestic Water Samples

All the water samples taken in the Southern Sub District for bacteriological analyses complied with the relevant standards as prescribed in the South African National Standards for Drinking Water, SANS 241:2015.

Food Sampling - Bacteriological Analysis

A total of 39 of the 29 food samples taken complied with the relevant standards prescribed in the Foodstuffs, Cosmetics and Disinfectants Act (54/1972). These samples included food products, bacteriological swabs from the hands of food handlers and surfaces where food products are prepared. The necessary remedial actions were taken in all cases of non-compliance which included written notices to owners and managers of restaurants, butcheries, etc as well as training of food handlers where the 5 Keys to Safe Food program were presented, which focus on the following key messages:

- a. Keep clean
- b. Separate raw and cooked foods
- c. Cook thoroughly
- d. Keep food at safe temperatures
- e. Use safe water and raw materials

In as much as the City's target is 75%, we are aiming for 100 % compliance which is difficult as the food sector is an unpredictable environment where bacteriological growth is always apparent.

Special Operations

Environmental Health focused on Food Safety during the period under review monitoring the potential sale of Unsafe food products, sale of unlabeled food and general Hygienic conditions.

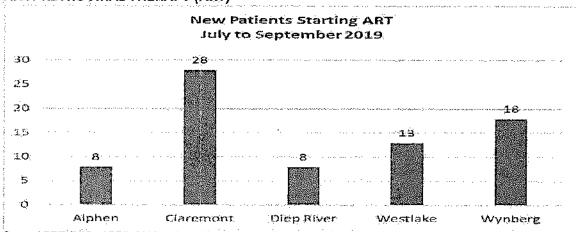
Interventions was undertaken in Constantia after complaints was received regarding elevated levels of copper in drinking water. This matter is being investigated by the Water Services Department.

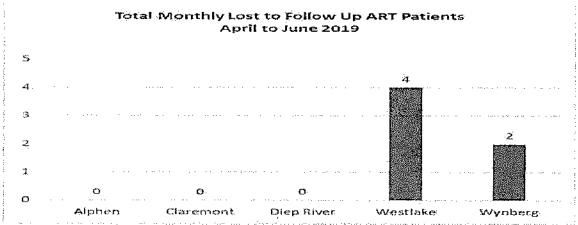
9. PERSONAL PRIMARY HEALTH SERVICES

ANTI-RETROVIRAL THERAPY (ART)



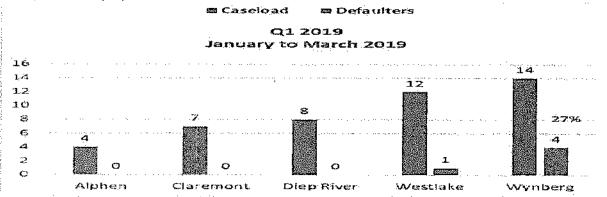

In Wynberg out of a caseload of 14 patients 4 patients, at 27% defaulted for various reasons. In Westlake 1 patient, at 8%, defaulted out of 12 registered. The caseloads are low thus the high percentages of lost to follow up.
