He played a pivotal role in calling for peace in the late 90's and early 2000 during the time Gugulethu was ravaged by gangsterism together with his neighbour, Mbuyiselo Gunguluza.

As part of the youth in the area, we are proud to have known and associated

ourselves with a hardworking and driven individual like Mr. Nceba Sandlana. Few days later, he was his 50th birthday, we would like to say, continue to grow wiser, continue to be a pillar of strength for many of us who seek positive role models to look after. We want to forward his name to the awards nomination process. We want to acknowledge good people while they are still alive.
