4. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report provides an overview of Area Central Library and Information Services (LIS) Urban Management Schedules as agreed to in the Internal Service Level Agreement (SLA) for the period 1 October 2018 to 31 December 2018.

The report reflects on service levels, standards, facility-based developmental programmes per facility, transversal and integrated programmes on multi-directorate and departmental level, non-compliance and innovation.

6. DISCUSSION/CONTENTS

Annexure A lists the programmes offered by the libraries as well as the number of attendees. The annexure also includes a breakdown of SmartCape sessions per gender and age category.

An overview of new membership, circulation, gate readings and SmartCape usage at the libraries, as well as an analysis of the types of programmes and the number of attendees per programme per library is attached as Annexure A.

Annexure B contains the list of Transversal Programmes held in Area Central for the period in question.

6.1. Service levels and standards

During the quarter in question all the libraries were able to meet their planned open hour targets.

Elsies River Library conducted 6 storytelling sessions during this quarter, which was well attended by 3 crèches in the area namely, Norwood, Avonwood and Siddique.

Belhar Library is continuing to foster healthy relations with 10 crèches. This has seen Peninsula Edu-care participating in our 16 days of activism against women and children. This has proven that children should be participants and not spectators in our quest against social challenges.

Bellville Library continues to provide block loans to 9 retirement homes in the community, a total of 1370 books were circulated from October to December 2018. The Books-to-go service delivered 570 books to 7 pre-schools in the area.

During this quarter, Bellville South Library continued its services to two ECD centres, Curious Cuties and Hansel and Gretel.

Parow Library also continued its services to Huis Martina and 190 books circulated successfully during this quarter.

During the period under review 2 reading programmes were conducted at Rylands Library which was attended by a total of 60 learners from 7 schools in the area.

Athlone Library accommodates various groups by providing them with a venue to conduct regular meetings. The organizations include various business forums situated around the library as well as community organizations and groups which meet at the library on a regular basis. The UCT Law Clinic and Diabetic 101 groups are examples of organizations which contribute to addressing community needs using the library as a vehicle to do so.

6.2. Facility-based developmental programmes per facility

The December holiday programme at Elsies River Library, "Safe Summer Holiday Programme December 2018" started off from the 10-14 December. The programme started with Kelly Morkel and her team from City Environmental Health demonstrating skills to kids that can easily save a life, Donavan Williams from City Water and Mzansi reminding attendees that saving water this summer is very important. It ended with electricity safety, arts & crafts sessions as well as chess, fun and games which were facilitated by staff.

Leonsdale Library had a diabetes awareness talk on the 14th November. This awareness talk is an annual event and is well supported.

A water saving programme took place at Valhalla Park Library with the following officials, Donovan Williams (Water Conservation), Kelly Gordon (Environmental Health), Natasha Sampson (Recreation and Parks), Mayedwa Perhe (Solid Waste Management) as well as Astrid, Alan, Rene and Jerome (staff) from Valhalla Park Library educated our children on being water wise. The programmes illustrated the significance of saving water on a daily basis. Rene organised the Vonkelvroue Mad Hatters Tea Party. The guest speaker, Theresa Schoeman Van Jaarsveld, a librarian from UCT and a fitness guru educated the ladies about healthy eating and exercise.

During the October and December 2018 school holidays, Bonteheuwel Library created a safe hub for 399 children. Here the children were exposed to Metro Police's Dog Unit, who exhibited the unique skills of their dogs. Metro Police and Safe-line also educated the children about their safety. The grade 6s and 7s of Rosewood Primary were invited to an orientation at the library. The library staff informed the pupils about their privileges as members of the COCT Public Library services. The library partnered with Rainbow of Hope, SAPS, Saartjie Baartman Centre and Peninsula Educare to host a "16 days of activism against women and children" programme. Saartjie Baartman outlined their services and that their service focuses on women and children in abusive relationships. Rainbow of Hope shared information and pamphlets. SAPS gave legal advice to the audience. SAPS also equipped the kids with tools for when they hear gunshots or if a stranger wants to abduct them.

An adult outreach programme was hosted by Bishop Lavis Library in partnership with Afrikaans Taal en Kultuur Vereeniging (ATKV). Over 50 seniors attended this programme. The Valhalla Park Clinic from the Department of Health, was also invited and their message was "be in control of your own health and remain healthy". The clinic did some hypertension, diabetes tests with the seniors, and an inspirational talk with the participants. Ms Elize Fortuin from ATKV addressed the seniors and spoke about women wellness and how to stay healthy and positive about life. The seniors were entertained with spiritual dancing by Ms. Phillider Oortman.

Bellville Library celebrated its centenary birthday during the week of 22 November 2018. A week-long celebration was held at the library and included various events and activities to celebrate this special milestone. The week was kicked off with a library tea and guest speakers entertained the guests with facts about Bellville and the library history. Bellville launched its very first online book club, and a high tea for the little ones was thoroughly enjoyed. An online poetry competition and Facebook promotion was well supported. A VIP breakfast was held for officials and the week ended on a high note with the Zero Waste Fashion Show and a long table was set up to promote literacy amongst the attendees.

In this quarter, Bellville South Library partnered with Young People @ Work and had a Digital Literacy Programme targeting young unemployed female youth in the community. The programme ran over 4 days with 32 attending. They were introduced to e-learning and by the end of the week they had their own e-mail addresses and could search for work online.

An NGO, "The Pink Ladies", held a session at Belhar Library on 24 November 2018 to sign up all the children in the area and have their details on hand in the event that they are reported missing. Local CPF and Belhar SAPS joined forces on this day making it a memorable activity. In collaboration with Metro Police and the local Belhar SAPS, the library hosted a 16 days of activism programme. Guest speakers such as local councillor Cr Johanna Martiow was invited to open the programme and well known author Grizelda Grootboom, kept the children enthralled when she shared her story. Mr Fredericks author of "Noem my Skollie" also shared his testimony as well as Ellen Pakkies. Different NGOs also attended this event such as Leticia Pool from Foundation for Alcohol Related Research Foundation (FARR).

Hanover Park Library conducted a World Aids Day event, which was attended by a total of 28 adults. This was a programme run in partnership with the local clinic; free testing and information was provided to the attendees.

Rylands Library conducted a successful Summer Chess Tournament, which was attended by 160 players of varying skill levels.

6.3. <u>Transversal Programmes</u>

The libraries presented transversal programmes in the youth stream in the area.

6.4. Directorate programmes

The following integrated programmes were held within Community Services and Health:

- Elsies River Library participated in a transversal programme on water resilience in conjunction with the other libraries in the area, Recreation and Parks and Social Development.
- Bishop Lavis Library hosted an adult outreach programme in partnership with the Department of Health, which focused on being in control of your own health.
- Ravensmead Library hosted holiday programmes in October and December 2018, Some of which were assisted by various other departments namely, Water & Sanitation, Sports & Recreation and Environmental Health.
