City is committed to the advancement of women

The City of Cape Town and sub council joins the rest of the nation in commemorating Women's Day, to celebrate the resilience and role of women in our communities and to highlight the challenges they face on a daily basis.

Cape Town dam levels increase to 100%

Dam levels have been increasing following substantial rainfall recently, some residents might be questioning whether water tariffs can be lowered. It is important to keep in mind that the amount of water in our dams, which we share with several other municipalities, does not directly influence the cost of delivering the overall water and sanitation service.

Residents who are registered as indigent do not pay the fixed part of the water tariff and receive a free allocation of water monthly.

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City renews its call to residents to get vaccinated

The Covid-19 vaccination limits the risk of severe disease and death, as well as transmission to others. Even persons who have recovered from the virus should be vaccinated, as the vaccine will improve and extend their immunity. Any person who has tested positive for Covid-19 should wait 30 days from the start of their symptoms before getting vaccinated. The City recognizes that this pandemic has taken its toll on our residents, and that fatigue has set in. However, the ongoing infections and fatalities too are very real and should serve as a constant reminder that we have to continue doing our bit to keep safe and prevent the fourth wave.
