2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to inform and give further consideration to grants-inaid projects as recommended by the Subcouncil in accordance with the Councils Policy for the allocation for Grants-In-Aid.

4. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Council, on 30 May 2019 as part of the City's Original 2019/20 Budget, approved budget for ward allocation projects. Within the operational budget, an amount of R120 000 was made available to be utilized for Grants-in-Aid in Subcouncil 24 in respect of Wards 15 and 109 as indicated below.

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WPX.001597 - Grants-in-Aid - R90 000 - Ward 15 WPX.001596 - Grants-in-Aid - R30 000 - Ward 109
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Further and above that Cllr Gregory Peck of Ward 15 decided to supplement an amount of R30 000 towards the Grants-in-Aid project from the additional R150 000 budget which was approved by Council. This additional funding of R30 000 which will get Council approval in the January Adjustment Budget in 2020. The total ward allocation amount for grants-in-aid in Ward 15 will be R120 000 available to be paid towards the successful beneficiaries.

The Subcouncil Manager together with the Ward Councillors as part of a prescreening process met on 06 August 2019. Ward Councillors recommended that Subcouncil allocate the R150 000 Ward Allocation Operational Budget for Grants-In-Aid within their respective wards:

Thereafter the applications were sent to the GIA Committee to verify and scrutinize the applications for Grants-In-Aid received from organizations in terms of the approved Grants-In-Aid Policy.
