DRAFT SPORT ASSETS MANAGEMENT POLICY

In order to regulate management of the City of Cape Town's sport facilities, a strategic framework was developed in the 2000/01 financial year. Municipal Facility Management Committees (MFMCs) were then established to improve communication between the City and sport clubs. Governance measures were also introduced on how best to manage sport facilities as public assets.

The City now seeks to review this framework and formalise a Sport Assets Management Policy to guide the management, maintenance and usage of its sport facilities.

The policy aims to guide the interaction between the Municipality, the sporting fraternity and users of sport facilities in terms of roles and responsibilities of role-players, accessibility, sustainable use and an improved asset management approach to all sport facilities.

In terms of section 17 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, Act 32 of 2000, the public and interested parties or groups are given the opportunity to submit comments, recommendations or input on this proposal to the municipality from 1 November - 15 December 2021 and 15 January - 31 January 2022.
