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Good Day Mr. Venter

I hope you are well. Some comment:

The Durbanville Community Forum (DCF) was involved in meetings as well as offering comment regarding the vision that would encompass the 'district' involved. Durbanville is rich in heritage and we need to preserve the little we have left. The DCF feels that once the heritage project is completed it will be an enhancement and a draw card for Durbanville.

The DCF hopes it will make the community both those that live in Durbanville and throughout Cape Town to come and explore what Durbanville's has to offer. This would include the actual town' including our wine farms as an example.

One has to but look at Rust-en-Vrede in Wellington Street, an absolute Mecca of heritage and culture. I would consider Durbanville as the Jewel of the North. The DCF has interacted with members of the community where there was both positive and negative comment. The negative comments were mainly based on the R10 million it was felt could have been utilized for more pressing needs.

To quote from the booklet:

"The site contains a rich history revolving around elements that made up the outspan including; a spring, water furrow, a feeding and drinking trough and evidence of human movement and activity connected to the establishment of farms by the Dutch East India Company (VOC).

The concept focuses on celebrating these historic elements while also grounding the site within its surrounding urban context. The initial challenge was to celebrate historic elements while also creating easy pedestrian circulation through the site. This was achieved through the manifestation of the tracks typically left behind by old ox wagons as they make their journeys to and from the Outspan. We have interpreted these tracks as curvilinear elements that extend the length of the site and into the adjacent roads. These 'tracks' serve multiple functions such as pathways, ramps, signage and lighting. At points, they form decorative, playful elements on the site"

As above this area played a significant part in Durbanville's history and should be remembered as such.

"In terms of section 17 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, Act 32 of 2000, the public and interested parties or groups are given the opportunity to submit comment, recommendations or input on this proposal to the municipality from 1 to 30 October 2015"

As far as the actual notification is concerned where the public has been requested to offer comment whether the current "Voortrekker Road" should be changed to "Pampoenkraal Lane" The DCF states that it has no issue with the name "Pampoenkraal Lane" as it fits in with the

'Historical' element. (The cost impact it feels should be low in comparison to the overall project cost). The DCF feels that once the project is complete (with enough historical signage information etc) that the name change will lend a certain ambiance to the area.

Plan to rename Voortrekker Road welcomed

The Durbanville Community Forum (DCF) has welcomed a City of Cape Town proposal to change the name of Voortrekker Road in Durbanville to Pampoenkraal Lane.

DCF chairman George Siemba said the move would have positive spin-offs for the community.

"I was involved in meetings with the City of Cape Town as well as

offering comment during this process. Durbanville is rich in heritage, and we need to preserve the little we have left. The DCF feels that, once completed, it will be a drawcard for Durbanville."

He hopes the development will

encourage the community to explore its history and a culture rich in art and winemaking.

"One just has to but look at Rusten-Vrede in Wellington Street – an absolute mecca of heritage and culture. I would consider Durbanville as the jewel of the north. There has also been much positive response regarding this project," he said.

Ward 21 councillor Theresa Uys said the costs of the project were in line with the normal costs associated with a renaming and that the street was a "really short street and will affect a limited number of people".

Ms Uys said the renaming of Voortrekker Road to Pampoenkraal Lane would form part of the Heritage Walkway and would also eliminate confusion between it and the other Voortrekker Road in Bellville.

Ms Uys said the costs of the proposed name change would be finalised once the public participation process had been concluded and the name change approved.

Last year, the Northern News reported on the City's plans to turn the former pumpkin patch in Durbanville into a park ("Big plans for Pampoenkraal," August 28 2014).

Construction to upgrade the public open space next to Voortrekker Road started earlier this year.

Ed Brymer, 81, of Onze Molen, who has lived in Durbanville for almost four decades, shared some interesting historical facts about

the area in August last year.

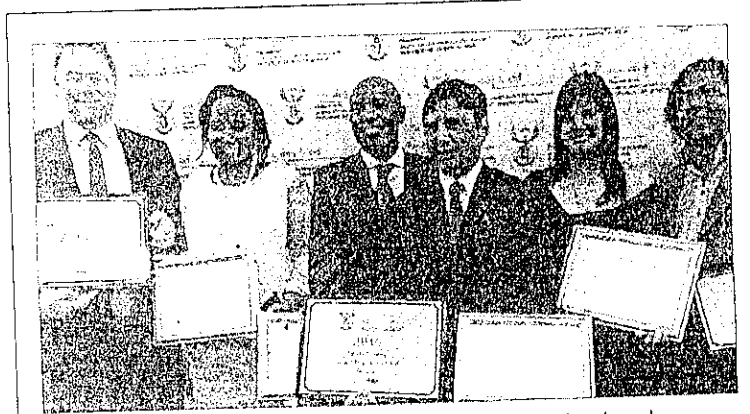
"The farmers stopped off at the sweet fountain close to the Durbanville Children's Home. Pumpkins grew around the fountain and that is where Durbanville's initial name, Pampoenkraal, came from," he recalled.

The Durbanville Heritage Society was given an opportunity to

comment on this but said it would do so only after its next meeting, scheduled for this week.

The public participation process is under way and you have until Friday October 30 to comment.
