This report gives effect to the IDP strategic focus area 4, i.e. the Inclusive City and more specifically strategic objective 4.1 " Ensure responsiveness by creating an environment where citizens can be communicated with and be responded to".

4. PURPOSE

To provide the Naming Committee, with the public comments gathered during the October 2015 public participation process on the proposal to rename a portion of 58th Avenue situated in Wynberg Park to Wynberg Park Avenue.

6. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The proposed naming of a portion of 58th Avenue to Wynberg Park Avenue was submitted for public participation during the month of October 2015. The process received a total of thirty-three (33) Comments of which twenty-nine (29) were in support of the name change and four (4) made alternative proposals.

7. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Naming Committee consider the outcome of the public participation process conducted and advise the Executive Mayor in terms of section 9.1 of the Naming Policy 2012.

8. DISCUSSION/CONTENTS

On 22 April 2015, Councillor Elizabeth Brunette submitted a motion to Subcouncil 20 for the purposes of renaming a portion of 58th Avenue situated in Wynberg to Wynberg Park Avenue.

58th Avenue originally linked to Klassen Road and Brink Drive was severed when the "2 Military Hospital" was built, creating two roads with identical names.

In light of the aforementioned, residents of these two roads are negatively affected by delivery and emergency services due to confusion in locating specific addresses.

The proposal was submitted for a localised public participation process during the month of October 2015. To ensure inclusive participation, various push and pull communication tools were implemented, namely:

- Door to door surveys in and around the affected roads
- Advertisement in the Weekend Argus
- Advertisement in the Die Burger
- Advertisement in the community newspaper
- Publication via the Have Your Say website
- Reports served before the affected Subcouncils for comments
- Circulation via the Community Organisation Database

During the process a total of 33 comments were received, of which 29 are insupport of the renaming proposal and 4 submitted an alternative naming proposal. Those who were insupport of the naming proposal felt that the name change would clarify directional issues. Two (2) of the 4 individuals submitted alternative names, namely Parklane and Dr. Helen Robinson, with the latter being supported by the 2 other participants.

8.1. Constitutional and Policy Implications

Section 152 (1) (e) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa: “encourage the involvement of communities and community organisations in the matters of local government”.

Chapter 4 Section 17 (1) (b) of the Local Government Systems Act 32 of 2000: “Participation by the local community in the affairs of the municipality must take place through – the mechanisms, processes and procedures for participation in municipal government establishment in terms of this Act”.

Section 9 (ss-9.1) of Amended Naming Policy 2012: “Council must establish a Section 80 Committee (the Naming Committee) to advise the Executive Mayor on all issues relating to naming, renaming and the implementation of this policy so as to enable the Executive Mayor to make recommendations to Council.


