5. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Whilst Water Conservation education and awareness is an ongoing and daily responsibility for City officials in Water Demand Management (WDM), Water Week and Water Month offer excellent opportunities each year to focus on specific water issues and give greater visibility to existing efforts.

Water Week 2011 holds huge significance for the City this year. The three components of Water Week 2011 (UN-World Water Day, National Water Week and the City's own Water Month) have been linked together through various international, national and local partnerships, which include the three spheres of government, UN Habitat, Consulate General of the Kingdom of Netherlands and the corporate sector). These partnerships have been brought together through a unifying message "For Love of Water" (FLOW).

World attention will be focussed on Cape Town for the duration of the UN World Water Day conference ($20^{th}-22^{nd}$ March), at the CTICC, for a high level conference for African Ministers, Mayors and other high level global heads under the theme of "Water and Urbanisation". Added to this there will be live link ups around the world to countries including: Fiji, Bangkok, Manila, Zaragoza, Amsterdam, Senegal, Washington and Rio. The City has been invited to be part of the exhibition running from $20^{th}-22^{nd}$ for the benefit of the delegates (For more detailed information of conference See Annexure I).

The Water Week / Water Month partnership programme (Annexure II) includes several events / activities where the City has committed support, some where no support is required and others where the City leads and has the bulk of the responsibility, including funding. Particular attention is directed to the Walk for Water (open to all Cape Town residents and visitor), the learners Expo at Ratanga Junction (open to learners across the City) and the Community Engagement programme focused on specific areas during Water Month.

Pre- and Post-Water Month, all efforts will revert back to the existing Water Conservation Programme (as illustrated in Annexure III). Water Conservation holds an existing and already approved annual budget

7. DISCUSSION/CONTENTS

The everyday tasks and responsibilities of WDM officials is Water Conservation. Water Week and Water Month each year offers excellent opportunities to focus on specific water issues and give greater visibility to existing efforts and 2011 will provide the platform for even greater visibility for the City.

Water week 2011 holds huge significance this year. The three components of Water Week 2011 (UN-World Water Day, National Water Week and the City's own Water Month) will be brought together in collaboration and linked through various international, national and local partnerships, which include the 3 spheres of government as well as the corporate sector). The Water Institute of South Africa (WISA) worked with Department Water Affairs (DWA) and tasked an independent facilitator to conceptualise and design a linking message to unify all water conscious stakeholders and interested parties and this message is "For Love of Water" (FLOW).

World attention will be directed on the City for the duration of the World Water Day conference (20th – 22nd March), at the CTICC, which is a high level conference for African Ministers, Mayors and other high level global heads under the theme of "Water and Urbanisation". Added to this there will be live link ups



around the world to countries including: Fiji, Bangkok, Manila, Zaragoza, Amsterdam, Senegal, Washington and Rio. The City has been invited to be part of the exhibition running from $20^{th} - 22^{nd}$ for the benefit of the delegates. Arrangements are in progress for City participation in this regard and a separate report prepared (For more information on the Conference, see Annexure I)

The partnership programme (Annexure II) includes several events / activities where the City has committed support on various levels, some where no support is required and others where the City holds the bulk of the responsibility (i.e. proposed by the City). Most of these events are those linked with the unifying message "for love of water". Not all the events listed in Annexure I have been fully committed to by the recommended partners, but that should not prevent the City from committing to playing a leading role in one or two main events like the Walk for Water and the Learner's Expo. The Learner's Expo at Ratanga Junction as well as the Water Month Community Engagement Programme (Annexure II) which already has budget committed to it from approved budget.

- The Walk for Water: This is open to all City residents and visitors. The City has organised several Water Fun Walks on Human Rights day in previous years and the proposed walk this year along the Fan Walk could easily be developed into an annual family fun event on the City's Events Calendar, reigniting the atmosphere of the World Cup. The walk will create a higher appreciation of water whilst reminding residents of the fact that many women and children in South Africa and Africa have to walk several Kms for water every day. A pledge stating "I am for love of water" will be signed by all the Cape Town residents who complete the walk. This is an International event this year and can be linked to other walks across the globe. This event will rely heavily on collaboration between several internal departments to ensure its success but it is important that this should remain a City event, but may also need to look externally to assist with funding. If external support is requested, then external branding rights might over-run city branding, therefore internal funding would be preferable.
- 2. Learner's Water Expo: This event is open to Learners from across the City. Learner's will be exposed to an informal settlement, where they will experience how, on a daily basis, people have to collect water, they will collect water and convey it to Intaka Island where they will be part of a learning experience testing water and after that will be transported to Ratanga Junction, where they will have to put into practice what they have learned on the day to better equip them in the future. This is a collaborative event with WISA Young Water Professionals and SAICE
- 3. WDM Community Engagement Programme: Throughout March this active programme is aimed at community, businesses, industry, schools etc. to promote water consertaion, water by-laws, similar to recent programme in Far South area.

After the last Water Month event has taken place, all efforts will revert back to the existing Water Conservation Programme (as illustrated in Annexure III).
