

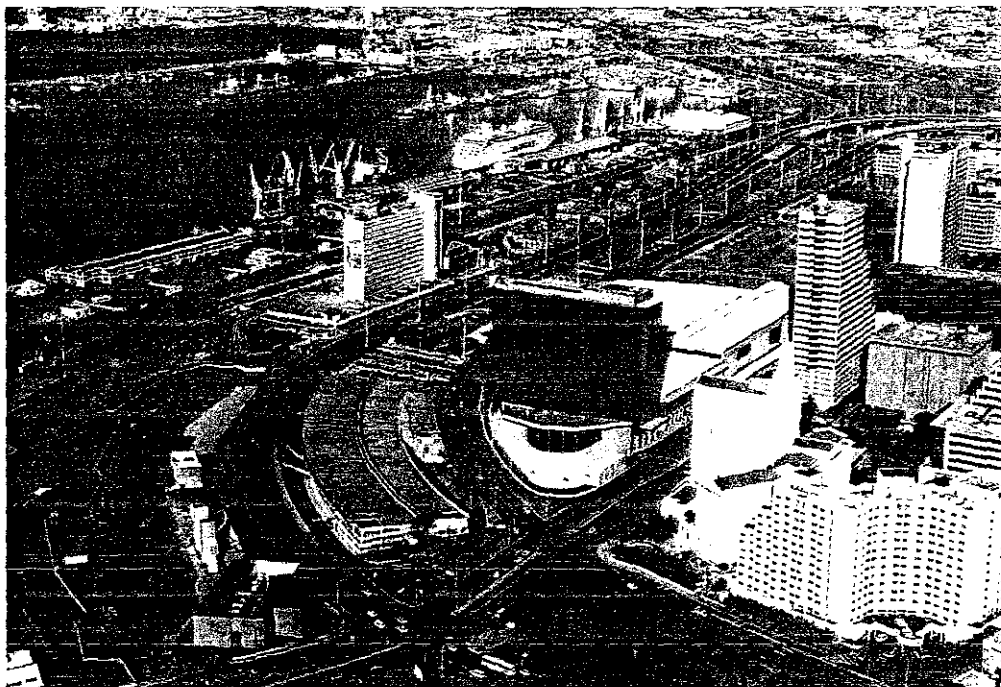

Introduction

This is the first announcement of the World Water Day (WWD) 2011 to be hosted on March 22 in Cape Town by the Government of South Africa, in collaboration with UN-Water, the African Ministers' Council on Water (AMCOW), The United Nations Secretary General's Advisory Board on Water and Sanitation (UNSGAB), the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) and the United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-HABITAT).

About World Water Day

International World Water Day is held annually on March 22 as a means of focusing attention on the importance of freshwater and advocating for the sustainable management of freshwater resources.

An international day to celebrate freshwater was recommended at the 1992 United Nations Conference on Environment and Development (UNCED). The United Nations General Assembly responded by designating 22 March 1993 as the first World Water Day.

WWD 2011 Theme

Each year, World Water Day highlights a specific aspect of freshwater. UN-Water has dedicated WWD 2011 to the theme *Water and Urbanization*. The objective of WWD 2011 is to focus international attention on the impact of rapid urban population growth, industrialization and uncertainties caused by climate change, conflicts and natural disasters on urban water systems. It will encourage action by governments, organizations, communities, and individuals around the world to actively engage in addressing urban water management challenges. UN-HABITAT is coordinating the organization of the WWD 2011 on behalf of UN-Water.

Partnership Opportunities

A number of UN-Water members and partner organizations have expressed interest in organizing side events and exhibition during WWD 2011. These include the UN-Water Decade Programme on Advocacy and Communication (UNW-DPAC), the UN-Water Decade Programme on Capacity Development (UNW-DPC), the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), the World Bank and the World Water Council, The Global Water Partnership, the African Development Bank and ICLEI - Local Governments for Sustainability, among others.

Message from UN-HABITAT

Access to water is vital to the location and growth of cities. Great civilisations such as the Roman Empire, Egyptian civilization, the Venetian Empire and the Omayyad Dynasty, among others, were founded on river banks which provided their inhabitants with freshwater. It is also around such rivers like the Nile, Euphrates, Tigris and Indus that agricultural activities thrived and trade flourished. Modern cities like London, Paris, Moscow, Cairo, New Delhi and Stockholm are built on the banks of rivers and lakes.

As cities grow and their populations increase, water scarcity is becoming an increasing constraint to urban development. New sources are more costly to develop and lack of control of city wastes results in increasingly polluted water sources resulting in environmental degradation and higher costs in water treatment.

Investments in infrastructure have not kept up pace with the rate of urbanization. Water and waste services have not been given the priority they deserve, and they show significant underinvestment, in comparison with its economic returns. Africa for example invests only 4% of its GDP in infrastructure as opposed to 14% in China. Water services are undervalued and water is underpriced (African water utilities forgo \$1.8 billion in revenues against the costs of water production).

Utilities in developing countries are characterised by high unaccounted for water, bloated staffing, weak governance and financially unviable operations. Whilst there are some important exceptions, in general they have a significant way to go in improving efficiency and effectiveness.

The poor in cities receive the worst services: piped water coverage is declining in many settings and yet the poor pay the highest water prices. Few urban authorities in developing countries have found a sustainable solution to urban sanitation. They cannot afford to extend sewers to the slums; nor can they treat the volume of sewage already collected. Solid waste disposal is a growing threat to health and the environment. Urban sector institutional arrangements are fragmented, lack effective regulation and roles are not structured for efficiency or success.

There is growing evidence that the water infrastructure will also be significantly affected by climate change, particularly through the impact of floods, droughts, or extreme events. Water resources are expected to change, both in quantity and quality; and water, storm water and wastewater facilities will face greater risk of damage caused by storms, floods and droughts. The effect of climate change will mean more difficult operations, disrupted services and increased cost for water and wastewater services.

The global celebrations of World Water Day 2011 (WWD 2011) provide a good opportunity to alert the world to the adverse global situation in urban water management, and to encourage seizing opportunities to address these formidable challenges. Through disseminating knowledge of successful approaches, it also seeks to give hope that solutions can be found. A principle objective of WWD 2011 is to celebrate success and better educate decision-makers, sector stakeholders and the world population about solutions.

Message from AMCOW

The African Ministers' Council on Water (AMCOW) is pleased to join UN-HABITAT in co-organizing World Water Day (WWD) 2011. The global observance of WWD 2011, to be hosted by the Government of South Africa in Cape Town with the theme *Water and Urbanization*, provides a good opportunity to discuss a range of options for tackling urban water and sanitation challenges facing the African continent.

In the last five decades, Africa has experienced an unprecedented demographic shift. In 1950, the urban share of the total population in sub-Saharan Africa was only 14.5 percent; in 1980 it increased to 28 percent and further increased to 34 percent in 1990. With an estimated annual average growth of 3.31%, the urban population is expected to reach 50 percent by 2020 and 60 percent by 2025. An even more significant figure is that today 71.9 per cent of urban Africans live in slums. This figure is 46 percent in Asia and a little over 30 percent in Latin America and the Caribbean.

With only five years to the date set for the attainment of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs), managing water and sanitation for the rapidly growing African cities and towns is undoubtedly an urgent priority for AMCOW. Although most African countries are still lagging behind in meeting the MDGs, significant steps have been taken to fast track regional and national efforts aimed at addressing water and sanitation.

The 3rd Africa Water Week held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia from 22-26 November 2010, provided an opportunity to highlight positive steps being taken by African countries in translating into action the regional commitments as outlined in the Sharm El Sheikh, Tunis and e-Thekwini declarations.

It is our hope that the global celebrations of WWD 2011 will build on the outcome of the 3rd African Water Week, especially in the African Caucus, which will bring together a high level panel composed of African Ministers, Mayors, civil society organizations, representatives of development banks and the private sector to brainstorm practical steps in accelerating the achievement of MDGs in Africa.

The WWD 2011 Exhibition and Fair

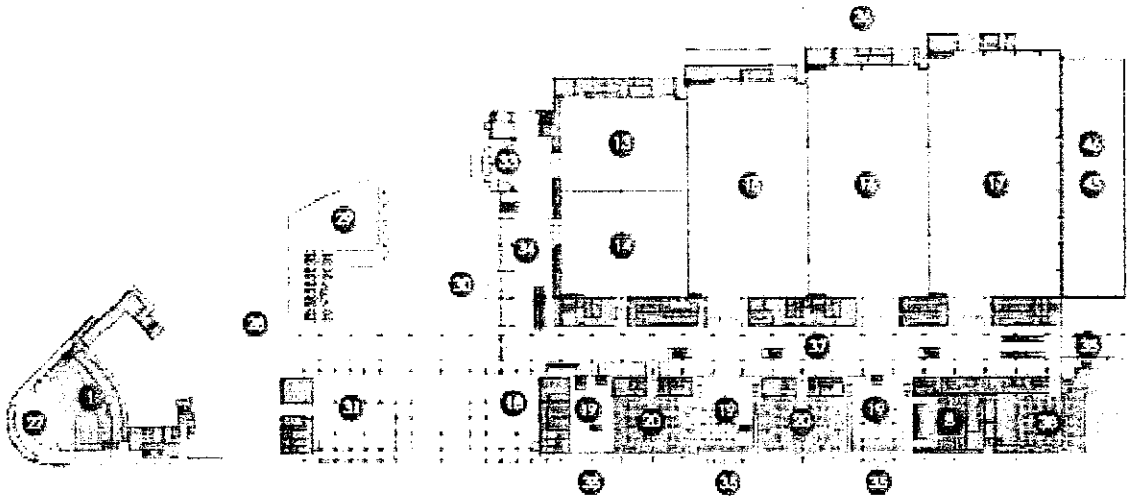
The WWD 2011 Exhibition and Fair will be open for three days from 20th - 22nd March to exhibitors from all over the world. The exhibit area will present 40 units of 16 - 20m², which will be available to a large and varied number of national and international exhibitors and on a *first-come-first-served* basis. Visitors to the fair will include 1,500 participants attending the Cape Town event as well as local visitors from South Africa.

At the fair is a large podium for presentations and entertainment. It will feature cultural events, speeches, interviews and worldwide videoconferencing via the Internet. All luncheons and reception parties will take place at the fair.

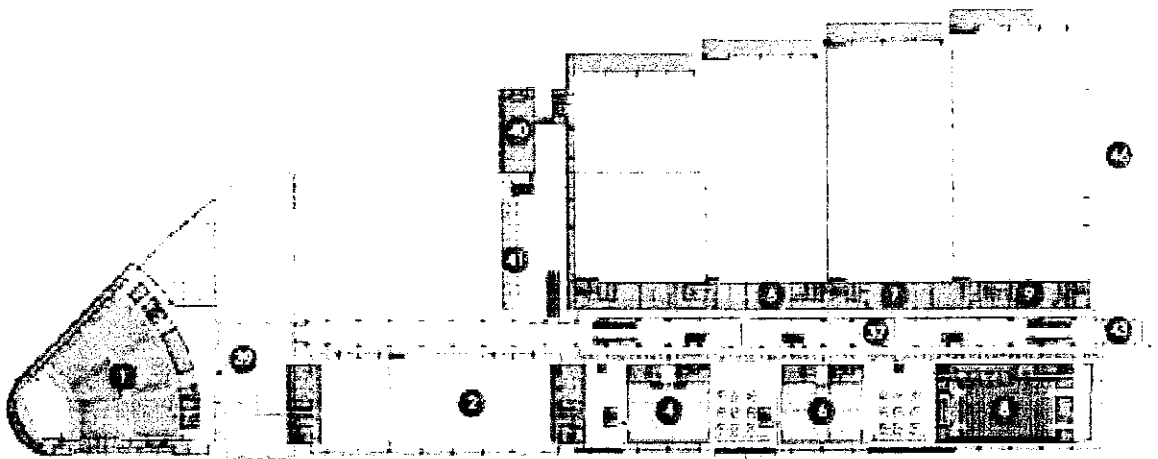
The opening of the Fair will be on 20th March with a spectacular show by African artists. The closing will be a joint effort with the Cape Town Jazz Festival, contributing to the World Water Day celebrations with performance, starting in the late afternoon on 22nd March and lasting until late in the evening.

A small unit at the Fair is priced at US\$ 5,500 or ZAR 39,000. The larger units cost US\$ 6,500 or ZAR 45,000. The exhibition and fair will be a non-profit venture; any extra revenues will be used to fund culture and community projects at the WWD 2011.

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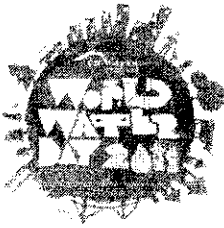

CONTRACT WITH THEBE EXHIBITIONS AND PROJECTS (PTY) LTD

STANDARD TERMS & CONDITIONS & SURETYSHIP

In this agreement the "organiser" means Thebe Special Projects Conferences and Events (Pty) Ltd, a wholly owned subsidiary of Thebe Exhibitions & Projects Group (Pty) Ltd and its successors in title or assigns and the "exhibitor" means the party detailed in application form, which application form is an integral part of this agreement

1. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1.1 The organiser shall do everything within its power to ensure that the location of the stand within the exhibition is as agreed in this agreement, the organiser shall have the right to relocate the stand at their discretion and the organiser shall not be held liable for any loss or damage, of whatsoever cause and howsoever arising in the event of a relocation.
- 1.2 Whilst the organiser will take all reasonable steps to ensure that access to and vacant possession of the stand is given to the exhibitor for the purpose of preparation and use of the stand upon the dates agreed in this agreement, such dates shall be variable in the discretion of the organiser so as to be compatible with the successful organisation of the exhibition as a whole and the organiser shall not be held liable for any loss or damage, of whatsoever cause and howsoever arising in the event of a delay.
- 1.3 The organiser does not warrant that the stand is suitable or fit for the purpose intended by the exhibitor or that the stand shall be in any particular condition or state of repair. The exhibitor acknowledges that it has satisfied itself that the stand is suitable for the purpose intended.
- 1.4 The organiser reserves the right in its sole and absolute discretion, should the venue become unusable for whatsoever reason, to relocate to a new venue in the best interests of the exhibition as a whole, and furthermore subject to the terms and conditions of this agreement and the organiser shall not be held liable for any loss or damage, of whatsoever cause and howsoever arising in the event of a relocation.
- 1.5 The organiser reserves the right in its sole and absolute discretion, should the dates become unsuitable for whatsoever reason, to reschedule the dates to a time more advantageous to the success of the exhibition as a whole and the exhibitor agrees to be bound by such dates and the organiser shall not be held liable for any loss or damage, of whatsoever cause and howsoever arising in the event of a rescheduling.
- 1.6 The parties agree that the rule of interpretation to construe contract terms against the drafter, namely the *contra proferentum* rule shall not be applicable.
- 1.7 This agreement shall apply to all services rendered by organiser to the exhibitor, to the complete exclusion of any other terms and conditions, whether oral or in writing.
- 1.8 The headings in this agreement have been inserted for convenience only and shall not be used for nor assist or affect its interpretation.

2. CONSIDERATION, PAYMENT AND SURETY

- 2.1 The consideration recorded on the exhibitor's application to exhibit are exclusive of VAT and shall be payable strictly in accordance with the payment terms on the application, failing which the full amount owing shall become due and payable without notice.
- 2.2 The consideration payable by the exhibitor shall be paid without deferment, free of exchange and without any deduction or set-off of whatsoever nature.
- 2.3 The exhibitor acknowledges that:
 - 2.3.1 payment is required in full by the 07 March 2011 in order to guarantee the exhibitors participation in the show
 - 2.3.2 all payments made to the organiser shall only be deemed to have been received by the organiser when same is actually delivered to the organiser and all risk in and relating to such payments shall lie with the exhibitor until date of delivery to the organiser;
 - 2.3.3 payments made directly into the organiser's bank account shall be at the exhibitor's risk until confirmed as cleared funds by the organiser's bankers; and
 - 2.3.4 unless otherwise specifically directed in writing by an authorised representative of the organiser, no third party is authorised to accept any payment due by the exhibitor on behalf of the organiser.
- 2.4 In the event of any amount not being paid by the exhibitor to the organiser on due date, the organiser will have the right, in addition to and without prejudice to any of the organiser's other rights or remedies in law:
 - 2.4.1 to charge interest at the rate of 17 % compounded monthly interest from due date of payment until payment is received in full, including payment for all costs and expenses (including legal costs on an attorney own client scale) incurred by the organiser in connection with the recovery of any payment due to it by the exhibitor; and

- 2.4.2 to claim all other amounts owed by the exhibitor to the organiser which shall forthwith become due and payable.
- 2.5 The organiser shall, in its sole and absolute discretion be entitled to appropriate any and all payments made by the exhibitor towards the payment of any debt or obligation of whatsoever nature owed by the exhibitor to the organiser, irrespective of when or how such obligation or debt arose.
- 2.6 A certificate signed by a director of the organiser as to the amount owing to the organiser by the exhibitor at any time shall be admitted as evidence in any legal proceedings or for any other purpose whatsoever and shall constitute *prima facie* proof of its contents and of the amount owing by the exhibitor to the organiser.
- 2.7 Should the exhibitor want to cancel their participation on the show – a LETTER OF CANCELLATION must be sent to the organiser. The organiser will not accept a cancellation if the exhibitor has not given written notification and the organiser shall not be obliged to accept or agree to a cancellation.
- 2.8 If the exhibitor cancels the agreement and the organiser agrees to accept such cancellation, the exhibitor will be liable for 100% of the agreement value subject to the cancellation being made after the 01 February 2011.
- 2.9 If the party signing this agreement on behalf of the exhibitor has not been authorised to do so the exhibitor hereby agrees that in such case its members, directors or partners as the case may be shall be personally liable for all obligations in terms of this agreement.
- 2.10 Should the Exhibitor be a Company, Close Corporation, Trust, Association or Partnership, then the signatory hereto agrees to bind him / herself as surety for and co-principal debtor with the Exhibitor for all amounts owing by the principal debtor in terms of this Agreement to the Organiser. The Signatory hereto, further hereby renounces the benefits and defences of exclusion and division.

3. STAND PREPARATION

- 3.1 The organiser shall be entitled to issue written and oral directives and orders from time to time regarding methods and materials of construction, stand layout, design and quality of installation and the exhibitor shall timeously comply with such directives and orders.
- 3.2 The organiser shall at all times be entitled to free and undisturbed access to the stand during the preparation and use thereof by the exhibitor.
- 3.3 If the organiser so directs in writing the exhibitor shall be obliged to use a agreement or designated by the organiser for the purpose of preparing the stand and erecting the installation. If the organiser makes such designation:
 - 3.3.1 the exhibitor shall not be entitled itself or through any other agreement or to prepare the stand save to the extent that the designated agreement or declines to do so.
 - 3.3.2 the organiser shall incur no liability or responsibility for the due and proper performance by the designated agreement or of its obligations in terms of the agreement concluded with the exhibitor;
 - 3.3.3 the agreement concluded between the exhibitor and the designated agreement or shall be subject to the prior written approval of the organiser.
- 3.4 In any event the stand shall be prepared and the installation shall be constructed to a standard at least equal to the general standard of the remaining stands rented by other exhibitors at the exhibition.
- 3.5 After completion of the installation, the organiser shall be entitled to require the exhibitor to make such additions or changes to the installation, as it in its discretion requires.
- 3.6 Ownership in and to the shell scheme shall not pass to the exhibitor nor shall the exhibitor enjoy any rights in respect of the shell scheme save and except those specifically granted to it in terms hereof. Upon the termination of the exhibition the exhibitor shall return the shell scheme to the organiser in good condition, fair wear and tear accepted. During the course of the exhibition, the exhibitor shall maintain the shell scheme in good order and condition and shall follow all of the organiser's instructions from time with regard to the use and care thereof.

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4. USE OF THE STAND AND NO CESSIDN OR ASSIGNMENT

- 4.1 The exhibitor shall not use any form of visual or vocal apparatus on the stand, which cause an annoyance or nuisance to other exhibitors, the organiser or the landlord, or demonstrate any product, which produces excessive noise. Noise levels must be confined to the stand and no amplified sound may be heard outside the stand. Noise levels may not exceed 70 DB.
- 4.2 The exhibitor shall only be entitled to distribute literature and printed matter from its stand and shall not be entitled to distribute same anywhere else at the exhibition without the organiser's written consent.
- 4.3 The exhibitor shall not be entitled to cede, assign, transfer, make over, sublet, subcontract, delegate or alienate any of its rights or obligations in terms of this agreement without the organiser's written consent.
- 4.4 The exhibitor shall keep the stand open and adequately staffed whenever the exhibition is open to the public.
- 4.5 The nature of the services to be provided to the stand or the exhibition site shall be in the sole and absolute discretion of the organiser.
- 4.6 All corner stands must be open on the aisles. Under no circumstances may the open side/s of an aisle stand be closed with any form of walling or partitioning.
- 4.7 Stand Sharing: Should you be sharing your exhibition space, please note a R4 000.00 ex vat surcharge will apply per exhibiting company per exhibition. This surcharge enables the organiser to supply each sharing exhibitor the same added benefits as the main stand holder and includes administration and registration of the sharing exhibitor.

5. ATTENDANCE

The organiser does not guarantee the number of persons expected to attend the exhibition and gives no warranties in this regard.

6. CANCELLATION & BREACH

- 6.1 The exhibitor shall not be entitled to cancel this agreement at any time without the written consent of the organiser and this will be subject to the conditions in 2.3 to 2.8 CONSIDERATION AND PAYMENT.
- 6.2 In the event that the organiser institutes legal action against the exhibitor in terms of the provisions of this agreement, then the exhibitor will be liable for the organiser's legal costs on the Attorney and Client scale, as well as collection commission, fees for tracers and advocates fees.

7. EXCLUSION OF LIABILITY

- 7.1 The organiser shall not be responsible for any special, direct, indirect or consequential loss or damage to the stand or other property of any kind brought into the exhibition by the exhibitor, its servants, employees, agents, contractors or invitees or for any injury to the person of an exhibitor, or any of its servants, employees, agents, contractors or invitees howsoever such loss or damage to the stand or property; or injury to person may be caused and notwithstanding that such loss or damage to the stand or property, or injury to person may have been occasioned by the fault, neglect or gross negligence of the invitees or by the exhibition site being in or falling into a defective state of repair.
- 7.2 In addition, and not limiting the generality of the foregoing, under no circumstances shall the organiser be liable towards the exhibitor or any other person for any loss of any nature whatsoever and howsoever arising, including but not limited to lost goodwill, loss of profits, loss of revenue or, difficulties which may arise out of this agreement.
- 7.3 The exhibitor hereby indemnifies the organiser against all and any actions, claims, demands, costs, charges or expenses arising or resulting directly, or indirectly from any act, omission or negligence by the exhibitor, its servants, agents, contractors or invitees notwithstanding that such action, claim, demand, cost, charges or expenses may have been occasioned in whole or in part by the fault, neglect or gross negligence by the organiser, its servants, employees, agents, contractors or invitees, or by the exhibition site or any installations thereof being of falling into a defective state of repair.

8. RIGHT TO USE EXHIBITORS NAME

The exhibitor hereby authorises the organisers to use the exhibitor's name and photographs for promotional purposes, and in so doing, the organiser undertakes not to use such name in a derogatory fashion or manner.

9. INSURANCE

The exhibitor is responsible for the insurance of any goods brought by them into the exhibition halls. The organisers will not be held liable for any loss in respect of such goods from any cause whatsoever and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, whether by theft, fire, breakage and/or negligence of any persons.

10. GENERAL

- 10.1 No variation of this agreement shall be of any force or effect unless reduced to writing and signed by the parties hereto
- 10.2 No indulgence or extension, which the organiser may allow to the exhibitor, will be regarded as a variation of this agreement, or a waiver of the organiser's rights in terms of this agreement.
- 10.3 No remedy conferred by this agreement are intended to be exclusive in any other remedy which is otherwise available in law, unless expressly limited in this agreement. Each remedy shall be accumulative and in addition to any other remedy granted in terms of this agreement or otherwise available in law. The election of any one or more remedy by any of the parties shall not constitute a waiver by such party of the right to pursue any other remedy.
- 10.4 If any provisions of this agreement are rendered void, illegal or unenforceable in any respect such provision shall be severable and the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions of this agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- 10.5 This agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts which, when read together, will constitute a single binding agreement.
- 10.6 For the purpose of delivery of all notices and / or processes arising from or in connection with this agreement, the exhibitor chooses as its *domicilium citandi et executandi* the address stated in the exhibitor's application to the OR registered office of the exhibitor.
- 10.7 The parties hereby agree that the law of the Republic of South Africa will govern this agreement.

11. STAND VETTING

In the interest of maintaining the quality level of the exhibition, the organisers will vet all the stands by 15h00 on the last day of build up. Should the exhibitors stand be below the standard of the exhibition or not fit the profile of the exhibition, The exhibitor will be given notice to fix the problem within 2 hours or the stand will be closed.

12. EXHIBITION FEES

- 12.1 Exhibitions fees for the basic stand is R39 000.00 excluding 14% South African Value Added Tax or \$5 500.00 excluding 14% VAT.
- 12.2 Exhibitions fees for the comprehensive stand is R45 000.00 excluding 14% South African Value Added Tax or \$6 500.00 excluding 14% VAT.
- 12.3 For International exhibitors, invoices will be issued according to the daily US Dollar / ZAR exchange rate.
